

Oregon Test Fee Program 2017-2019

Eligibility Criteria

Students in public schools will be considered eligible for payment/reimbursement of approved AP or IB examinations if they meet one or more of the following criteria:

1. The student is a member of a family whose taxable income for the preceding year did not exceed 185 percent of an amount equal to the poverty level for the current year determined by using poverty criteria established by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services. These levels for 2017-2018 are published in the Federal Register Vol. 82, No. 67, 4/10/17, pp. 17182-84. Schools can use the Household Income Survey:

2. The student are eligible for free and reduced price lunches established by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS);
3. The students qualify as an “identified student” because they are:
 - In foster care, or
 - Homeless or migrant, or
 - Living in households that receive SNAP/Food Stamps, TANF case assistance, or the Food Distribution on Indian Reservations benefits, or
 - Enrolled in a federal, state, or local program that aids students from low-income families.
4. The student is in the care/custody of the Oregon Department of Human Services’ Children, Adults and Families Division as a dependent child;
5. The student has status as a legally emancipated minor or, in the best judgment of the school principal and/or the Advanced Placement/International Baccalaureate Coordinator, is entirely responsible for his/her own support and may also have qualified for waiver of other school-related fees such as athletics, music or arts participation; or
6. The student is in the care/custody of the Department of Corrections/Oregon Youth Authority.
