What is the Summer SEED Survey?

The Summer Student Educational Equity Development (SEED) Survey is an optional student perception survey designed to help leaders better understand students' experiences in summer programs. The survey questions assess four areas of student engagement: accessible and engaging opportunities, cocreation and student interest, sense of belonging, and self-efficacy. These equity-driven constructs are foundational to high-quality summer programs and the basis of the ODE Summer Learning Best Practice Guide and Companion Toolkit.

What is the Purpose of the Summer SEED Survey?

The purpose of the Summer SEED Survey is to amplify student voice, refine program implementation, and shape decision-making. Summer programs are voluntary programs and the success of these programs depend on creating the contexts where students are likely to become engrossed in learning that matters and is meaningful to them. The findings from this survey have the potential to improve the quality of summer programs across Oregon.

How will Student Voice Data be Utilized?

The Oregon Department of Education will utilize survey data in the creation of reports and data briefs illustrating key impacts of summer learning from the student perspective. This information will determine technical assistance, professional development, and additional resources. Depending on sample size (N=10 or more respondents), districts may request a report from ODE to inform the continuous quality improvement of summer programming at the local level. Here is a look at our Summer SEED Survey Report from 2022.





Survey Overview

The following summarizes the basic survey administration procedures:

- Access to Survey: The district contact for the summer learning grant(s) will be sent the Summer SEED Survey materials via email. Districts should forward this guide and survey link to the schools/programs who will be responsible for survey administration at each summer program site. Please make sure the staff administering the survey to students have easy access to this guide.
- ➤ Online Administration. The survey is designed for online administration for convenience and prompt reporting of results. Districts can opt to use paper versions of the survey at their own cost. Links to paper versions of the survey are above.
 - ❖ Note: Each individual paper survey must be entered into the online survey platform using the same link as the electronic survey.
- Administration Period. For summer 2023, the survey window begins on June 15th, 2023 and closes on September 15th, 2023.
 - ❖ Note: Student surveys should be completed during summer programming, ideally in the last week of the summer program.
- ➤ **Voluntary Survey Participation.** A request for students to participate should be made, but ultimately this survey is voluntary.
- Privacy and Confidentiality. The survey results are confidential. We do not ask for identifying information from respondents; only aggregated quantitative results are available to grantees. We will not share survey results with a school or program that has less than 10 responses.
- ➤ **Reports.** Districts may request results of the Summer SEED Survey by emailing ODE at ODE.SummerLearning@ode.oregon.gov. We will send results to districts if the total respondent rate is 10 or more.
 - ❖ Note: Ensure students enter the school and district name on the survey form if requesting results.
- ➤ **Valid and Reliable.** To obtain a valid, reliable, and representative sample, programs should aim to gather as many surveys as possible.





- Assistance. ODE assistance is available to support you in planning and implementing the survey. Questions about administration of the survey or technical assistance should be directed to ODE.SummerLearning@ode.oregon.gov.
- Accommodations. Survey administrators must ensure appropriate accommodations for students, such as screen readers and pairing with an adult to read the questions aloud. This survey does not include any question types that are inaccessible or difficult to use for a screen reader (including sliders, drag and drop, image, etc.). As shown in the image below, this survey has received the highest accessibility score.





Survey Administration Tasks

The following is an overview of the major tasks to be completed to ensure survey administration success. Details follow in Task 2.



TASK 1 – Make Administration Arrangements

The Summer SEED Survey is completed online using the Alchemer platform to simplify planning and logistics for schools/districts.

- For online administration, each participant should go to the webpage link and complete the survey (no login is required). The district administrator should make sure the instructions are distributed to the appropriate summer learning staff and encourage a high rate of participation. Respondents can take the survey from any computer/device, at any convenient time during the survey window; they simply need the survey link.
- Districts can opt to use paper versions of the survey at their own cost, but are encouraged to
 use the electronic version. Each individual paper survey must be entered into the online survey
 platform using the same link as the electronic survey.

Make sure this administration guide is available and easy to access for the staff conducting the survey.

Plan multiple opportunities during the last week of the summer program for students in grades 3-12 to take the survey. The survey takes approximately 10-15 minutes to complete.








TASK 2 – DISTRIBUTE AND ADMINISTER SURVEY MATERIALS

Important Note: Students will be asked to enter the district name, school name, and funding source(s) for the summer program they are attending.

The district grant contacts that receive the survey information from ODE should be sure to communicate to the staff administering the survey which ODE grants/funding sources are being used for their programs. If the district or program staff are unsure which funding sources are being used, please see Appendix A for a table showing which districts and schools are receiving the main three ODE grants listed in the survey.





- Write the district name, school name, and applicable funding sources (SSA Summer, 21st Century, Title I-C, etc.) on a white board or place where all students can see it.
- Students who prefer to take the survey in Spanish, Russian, or Vietnamese can change the language using the dropdown located in the upper right corner of the electronic survey.





TASK 3 – MONITOR PARTICIPATION

A high level of participation should be encouraged to ensure that the data are representative and valid. Program leaders should employ strategies to ensure a higher rate of responses. These may include:

- Checking in with summer program staff at each site to ensure survey links or paper copies were administered to students.
- Creating make-up opportunities for students to take the survey.
- Providing incentives (e.g., extra recess, ice cream on Friday, etc.) to encourage participation.







TASK 4 – REVIEW RESULTS

Districts may request results of the Summer SEED survey from ODE by sending an email to ODE.SummerLearning@ode.oregon.gov. ODE will not publicly post disaggregated results at the school/program level. However, a state level report will be posted on the ODE Summer Learning Resources webpage.

Frequently Asked Questions

Q: Is the Summer SEED Survey required?

A: The Summer SEED Survey is optional. Districts are encouraged to administer this survey in all summer programs offered; however, districts may choose which site(s) to select for administration.

Q: How was the SEED Survey developed?

A: The Summer SEED Survey is directly aligned to the <u>Oregon SEED Survey</u> for the regular school year. ODE researched a range of national and international educational surveys including NAEP, TIMSS, PISA, and others. Items on national and international surveys undergo rigorous review on a regular basis; however, ODE recruited Oregon educators from diverse backgrounds and regions to review all prospective items for the SEED Survey using an Oregon lens. The summer SEED Survey includes some additional items based on the core concepts of the ODE Summer Learning Best Practice Guide and Companion Toolkit.

Q: If a district has a 21st CCLC (Title IV-B) or an SSA Summer Learning grant, which Summer SEED Survey link should we use?

A: This year, all participants will use the same link and have the students identify which funding sources are being used for the program in the survey.

Q: Since survey items are non-secure, can teachers or parents help students with the answers?

A: Some SEED Survey items ask students to evaluate their summer program experience, so it is important that students are provided with the privacy and independence needed to allow for personalized responses. Adults may help students better understand survey questions. For example, teachers or parents may read a question aloud or explain what a word means.

Q: Can the Summer SEED Survey be paused? What happens to partially completed surveys when the survey window closes?

A: The SEED Survey can be paused. However, for a 10-15 minute survey, it is best to create a window where students can complete the full survey in the allotted time provided.

Summer programs may use this script to introduce the survey to students before they complete it.

Key Messages for Educators and School Leaders

- > **Provides opportunity to hear directly from students.** The Summer SEED Survey gives students the opportunity to voice their summer learning experiences.
- ➤ An equity tool that meets the moment. The results of the survey give schools powerful information to create more equitable learning experiences based on the perceptions and lived experiences of students in their schools.
- Designed to capture students' sense of belonging and experience during summer programs. The survey asks students about their experience, their access to wellrounded opportunities, their choices in summer opportunities, and if they feel supported with a sense of belonging.
- Flexible administration options. The survey may be given in a proctored in-class session using the secure browser, or in a non-proctored 'assignment' that students may take online through a non-secure, web-based browser at any time within the selected window.
- ➤ **Takes 10-15 minutes.** A brief survey, with multiple choice questions for grades 3-12 and an additional three open-ended responses.
