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What is the Student Voice Summer Survey?

The Student Voice Summer Survey (formally the Summer SEED Survey) is a student perception survey designed to help leaders better understand students’ experiences in summer programs. The survey questions assess four areas of student engagement: accessible and engaging opportunities, co-creation and student interest, sense of belonging, and self-efficacy. These equity-driven constructs are foundational to high-quality summer programs and the basis of ODE’s [Summer Learning Best Practice Guide](#) and [Companion Toolkit](#).

What is the Purpose of the Student Voice Summer Survey?

The purpose of the Student Voice Summer Survey is to amplify student voice, refine program implementation, and shape decision-making. Summer programs are voluntary and the success of these programs depend on creating the contexts where students are likely to become engrossed in learning that matters and is meaningful to them. The findings from this survey have the potential to improve the quality of summer programs across Oregon.

How will Student Voice Data be Utilized?

The Oregon Department of Education will utilize survey data in the creation of reports and data briefs illustrating key impacts of summer learning from the student perspective. This information will determine technical assistance, professional development, and additional resources. Depending on sample size (N=10 or more respondents), **districts may request a report from ODE** to inform the continuous quality improvement of

summer programming at the local level. Here is a look at our Student Voice Summer Survey (*formally Summer SEED Survey*) [2022 Report](#) and [2024 Report](#).

Survey Overview

The following summarizes the basic survey administration procedures:

- **Access to Survey.** The district contact for the summer learning grant(s) will be sent the Student Voice Summer Survey materials via email. Districts should forward this guide and survey link to the schools/programs who will be responsible for survey administration at each summer program site.
 - ★ **Note:** Make sure the staff administering the survey to students have easy access to this guide.
- **Online Administration.** The survey is designed for online administration for convenience and prompt reporting of results. Districts can opt to use paper versions of the survey at their own cost.
 - ★ **Note:** Each individual paper survey must be entered into the online survey platform using the same link as the electronic survey.
There are **two versions of the paper survey (Grades 3-4 and Grades 5-12)** to accommodate different reading levels. Please use the appropriate version for your students.
- **Administration Period.** For summer 2025, the survey window begins on **June 25th**, 2025 and closes on **September 12th**, 2025.
 - ★ **Note:** Student surveys should be completed during summer programming, **ideally in the last week of the summer program.**
- **Voluntary Survey Participation.** A request for students to participate should be made, but ultimately this survey is voluntary².
- **Privacy and Confidentiality.** The survey results are confidential. We do not ask for identifying information from respondents; only aggregated quantitative results are available to districts. We will not share survey results with a school or program that has less than 10 responses.
- **Reports.** Districts may request results of the Student Voice Summer Survey by emailing ODE at ODE.SummerLearning@ode.oregon.gov. We will send results to districts if the total respondent rate is 10 or more.
 - ★ **Note:** Ensure students enter the district, school, and program name on the survey form if requesting results.
- **Valid and Reliable.** To obtain a valid, reliable, and representative sample, programs should aim to gather as many surveys as possible.

² While ESDs, districts, and schools that receive certain grants (see [Appendix B](#)) are required to offer and administer the Student Voice Summer Survey, students may choose not to participate.



- **Assistance.** ODE assistance is available to support you in planning and implementing the survey. Questions about administration of the survey or technical assistance should be directed to ODE.SummerLearning@ode.oregon.gov. Additional resources can also be found on the [State Summer Learning Grant webpage](#).
- **Accommodations.** Survey administrators must ensure appropriate accommodations for students, such as screen readers and pairing with an adult to read the questions aloud. This survey does not include any question types that are inaccessible or difficult to use for a screen reader (such as sliders, drag and drop, images, etc.). As shown in the image below, this survey has received the highest accessibility score.



Survey Administration Tasks

The following is an overview of the major tasks to be completed to ensure survey administration success. Details follow in Task 2.

☑ TASK 1 – Make Administration Arrangements

- ★ **Make sure this administration guide is available for the staff conducting the survey.**
- ★ Plan **multiple opportunities during the last week of the summer program** for students to take the survey. The survey takes approximately **10-15 minutes** to complete.

The Student Voice Summer Survey is completed online using the SurveyMonkey platform to simplify planning and logistics for schools and districts.

Online Administration:

Each participant should go to the webpage link and complete the survey (no login is required). The district administrator should make sure the instructions are distributed to the appropriate summer learning staff and encourage a high rate of participation. Respondents can take the survey from any computer/device, at any convenient time during the survey window; they simply need the survey link.

Paper Survey:

Districts may opt to use paper versions of the survey at their own cost, but are encouraged to use the electronic version. **Each individual paper survey must be entered** into the online survey platform using the same link as the electronic survey.

Please ensure your students enter the **program name, district (or ESD) name, and school name** for the summer program they are attending if:

- ☑ Your ESD, district, or school is receiving a grant³ that requires the administration of this survey; and/or
- ☑ Your district would like to request their survey results

3. Please select the **first letter/symbol** of the **school name** where your summer program is being held.

Helpful Tips:



Write the **program name, district (or ESD) name, and school name** on a white board or place where all students can see it.

→ The list of school names is separated into three alphabetized categories. Students should begin by choosing the first letter of their school name, and the survey will then prompt them to pick from a dropdown menu.



Students who prefer to take the survey in **Spanish, Vietnamese, or Russian** can change the language using the dropdown located in the upper right corner of the electronic survey.

☑ TASK 3 – Monitor Participation

A high level of participation should be encouraged to ensure that the data are representative and valid. Program leaders should employ strategies to ensure a higher rate of responses. These may include:

- Checking in with summer program staff at each site to ensure survey links or paper copies were administered to students.
- Creating make-up opportunities for students to take the survey.
- Providing incentives (e.g., extra outdoor play time, ice cream on Friday, etc.) to encourage participation.

☑ TASK 4 – Review Results

Districts may request results of the Student Voice Summer Survey from ODE by sending an email to ODE.SummerLearning@ode.oregon.gov. ODE will not publicly post disaggregated results at the school/program level. However, a state level report will be posted on the [ODE Summer Learning Resources webpage](#).

Key Messages for Educators and School Leaders

The Student Voice Summer Survey:

- ☑ **Provides opportunity to hear directly from students.** The Summer SEED Survey gives students the opportunity to voice their summer learning experiences.
- ☑ **Is an equity tool that meets the moment.** The results of the survey give schools powerful information to create more equitable learning experiences based on the perceptions and lived experiences of students in their schools.
- ☑ **Is designed to capture students' sense of belonging and experience during summer programs.** The survey asks students about their experience, their access to well-rounded opportunities, their choices in summer opportunities, and if they feel supported with a sense of belonging.
- ☑ **Has flexible administration options.** The survey may be given in a proctored in-class session using the secure browser, or in a non-proctored 'assignment' that students may take online through a non-secure, web-based browser at any time within the selected window.
- ☑ **Takes 10-15 minutes.** The survey is brief, with select-response items for grades 3-12 and an additional three open-ended responses.



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Frequently Asked Questions

Q: Is the Student Voice Summer Survey required?

A: It depends. ESDs, districts, and charter schools receiving a [21st CCLC \(Title IV-B\) Grant](#) and/or [HB 2007 State Summer Learning Grant](#) **are required** to administer the Student Voice Summer Survey for **all summer programs that use these grant funds and serve students entering grades 3-12**. A list of entities receiving each grant is included in [Appendix B](#).

For all other entities, the Student Voice Summer Survey is optional, though highly encouraged.

Q: Is the Student Voice Summer Survey the same as the SEED Survey administered during the regular school year?

A: No. While the Student Voice Summer Survey is aligned to the [Oregon SEED Survey](#) for the regular school year and contains some of the same questions, it also includes additional items based on the core concepts of ODE's [Summer Learning Best Practice Guide](#) and [Companion Toolkit](#). The Student Voice Summer Survey is also anonymous and completed online using the SurveyMonkey platform.

Q: Since survey items are non-secure, can teachers or parents help students with the answers?

A: Some Student Voice Summer Survey items ask students to evaluate their summer program experience, so it is important that students are provided with the privacy and independence needed to allow for personalized responses. Adults may help students better understand survey questions. For example, teachers or parents may read a question aloud or explain what a word means.

Q: Can the Student Voice Summer Survey be paused?

A: The Student Voice Summer Survey cannot be paused. As a result, it is best to create a window where students can complete the full survey in the allotted time provided.



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Appendix A: Example Survey Script

Summer programs may use this script to introduce the survey to students before they complete it.

Introducing the Survey

We want to know what you think about our summer learning program. This survey is important because your feedback will help us improve the program by learning how we can better support you! It only takes about 10-15 minutes, but there is no time limit. If you need a little more time, that's ok. A few things to note:

- *There are no right or wrong answers - this is not a test! We just want to know how you feel.*
- *No one will know what answers you give, so please answer honestly.*
- *Participation is voluntary, which means you don't have to take the survey or complete any questions that you don't want to answer. That said, we hope you will because your answers give us important information to help our program become even better.*



Anyone who does not wish to participate should tell me now.

Let's look at the first three questions together. For question 1, be sure to type or write in the name of the program that you attend. Our program name is (_____). For question 2, select our district [or ESD] name (_____) from the dropdown menu. You can quickly find our district [or ESD] name by typing the first letter (___). For question 3, choose the first letter of our school name (___), click "Next" and then select our school name (_____) from the dropdown menu. This information is also written on the whiteboard.

Now you can complete the rest of the survey. Please read each item carefully and mark one choice for each item. If you prefer not to answer a question just skip it.

If you have any questions or need help reading the survey, please raise your hand. When you are done, submit your answers and exit the survey.
