



AP and IB Examination Fees Funding Update For 2020-2021 School Year

To accelerate learning and promote equity for Oregon's students, the Oregon State Legislature has provided funding to reduce students' costs in taking Advanced Placement (AP) and International Baccalaureate (IB) exams.

The Oregon Department of Education has \$220,000 available for this program and can offset up to 50 percent of the exam cost for students who qualify for Free and Reduced Lunch.

The full price fees, price reduction and the cost to students are described below.

There will be no stipend for students who pay standard exam fees.
