Use results to...

- **Identify strengths** and celebrate growth.
- **Pinpoint areas** for instructional focus.
- **Inform instruction** and provide targeted support.
- **Monitor progress** and adjust instruction over time.

Focus on Learning Opportunities

- **Look at the results** to identify patterns.
- **Use multiple measures of learning** with classroom evidence.
- **Collaborate** between students, families, and educators to plan next steps.



DON'T

Use results to...

- **Label or Track** students.
- **Compare students** to one another.
- **Use results in isolation** or as the sole measure of achievement.
- **Make high-stakes decisions** about students.
