Increase the percent of students successfully graduating from Astoria High School in 4 Years to 85%.

Goal #2	Astoria High School will partner with Clatsop Community College and other accredited post-secondary institutions to offer and expand college coursework exposure through Simultaneous and Dual Enrollment Opportunities to increase student participation in college preparation and credit-bearing courses by 10% to 15% within focal populations.
Short-Term	By the end of the 2022-2023 academic year, staff from Astoria High School
Outcome	and Clatsop Community College will have collaborated to refine essential outcomes in dual-enrolled courses. Funds will continue to be allocated for this work as well as the promotion and enrollment of these courses.
