Goal #1	90% of students will be on track at the end of their ninth-grade year.
Short-Term Outcome	School teams (teachers, counselors, grad coaches, and administrators) are meeting regularly to review data and monitor course progress for ninth graders. This team is developing strategies to support students in successfully earning credit in their courses and working to communicate with families and teachers to provide wrap-around support for students.
Long-Term Outcome	The percentage of students on track by the end of their ninth-grade year will increase by 10%.
Goal #2	The overall percentage of students graduating will increase, especially for historically underrepresented groups.
Short-Term Outcome	School teams will monitor on-track course progression and determine strategies to support historically underrepresented groups.
Long-Term Outcome	The graduate rate will increase by 5% for all groups, including those that are historically underrepresented.
Goal #3	Students will develop a post-secondary path based on their interests and strengths that leads them towards college or career readiness.
Short-Term Outcome	Students, particularly those who have been historically underserved, will work with school staff to develop a plan and profile that includes rigorous coursework (such as AP, Dual Credit, IB, and CTE).
Long-Term Outcome	90% of students will develop a post-secondary plan.
Dropout Prevention Activity #1	Graduation coach Cadre (8 high schools) to support the success teams in individual schools. In addition, these coaches track data and meet with our Native American students.

Dropout Prevention Activity #2	Asst Director of Secondary Curriculum, Instruction and Supports - implementing and supporting Multi-tiered Systems of Supports. The supports include working with building staff (admin, Graduation Coaches, Student Success Instructors and Dean of Students) to support individual students and system level supports.

Dropout Prevention Activity #3	Two specialized smaller high schools opened in the fall of 2018. Both are targeted to students who are underserved and disengaged from school. Each school provides rigorous and relevant face to face instruction in unique contexts. Project- based, community intertwined is the focus of one school. EL learning is the focus of the second school. These schools are a choice option in our district and are meeting/exceeding enrollment projections each year.

Dropout Prevention Activity #6	Support for our underserved ELL population- Juntos and Avanza community partnerships in our high schools which work to build the Family and school connections and prepare students for post-secondary options. Staff Development for ELL and General Ed teachers, counselors and Grad Coaches to review ELL student progress and develop plans for them to stay on track and engaged in school. Collaborating with our Equity Coalition and community partnerships, we will reach out to our Native American families and students to see how we can better serve their needs. Increased ELL staffing, classroom EA support and Latino family liaisons to assist with translation and navigation of our high school systems.

FTE will also be provided for extending the Dual Immersion program into the high school and providing funds for Equal Opportunity Schools as a way to get more students involved in the AP programs. FTE will be used to provide additional instructional time for students dual enrolled in college classes, IB and AP courses. Middle schools are putting together First Time College and at-risk students for field trips and supplies.
