Lead Organization	Colton School District
Goal #1	By June of 2023, 100% of Colton School District Freshmen will be on track to graduate College and Career ready.
Short-Term Outcome	Ninth grade Academy support team, including Academy teacher, principal, college and career readiness teacher and school counselor will facilitate school-wide meetings to support freshmen needs, review data, organize small study groups, enroll in credit recovery classes by sophomore year (2023), communicate with families, and work together in Academy classes, and evaluate needs on a monthly basis, including student and family input. This work will be centered around our identified focal students, with intentional PD for staff around UDL..
Long-Term Outcome	The overall 9th grade on-track data will improve from 70% to 100%,with a focus on our identified focal groups.
Goal #2	Increasing the number of our identified focal groups to forecast and participate in Advanced Coursework by 10% a year.
Short-Term Outcome	We will have individualized meetings with all focal students and families to educate the benefits of taking AC. Parent/Community nights to discuss opportunities and the benefits of taking AC. Partnership with CCC to share information. Teachers encourage students to take advanced coursework. Naviance is provided starting in the 6th grade.
Long-Term Outcome	Our participations from identified focal groups will increase by 10% each year.
Dropout Prevention Activity #1	Credit Recovery- online program tailored to students' needs Scheduled one-on-one meetings for students not on-track (at least monthly)- check-in with counselor, individual teachers, advisors, and/or principal Freshman Academy- 9th grade on-track class- involves counselor, teacher and college/career educator
