Goal #1	95% of 9th-grade students will begin 10th grade with 6 or more credits.
Short-Term Outcome	The 9th-grade SLCs (English, science, and wellness teacher) will meet monthly to review students' behavior, attendance, and grades. Students and families are involved in the plan. The counselors and graduation coach will also support the students when needed. The 9th-grade success team will meet at each progress report or term-end to review data and make systemic changes. Specific focus will be on subgroups: students with disabilities and students
	experiencing poverty. Students who are not on track at the end of the 9th- grade year will attend summer courses to ensure they are on track by the beginning of the 10th-grade year.
Long-Term	Overall 9th grade on track will increase by 5%.

Goal #2	RHS on-time graduation rate will be 90%
Short-Term Outcome	Increase opportunities for students to enroll in CTE courses. Schoolwide Student Support Team will be bi-monthly (counselors, admin, grad coach, attendance monitor, registrar) to identify students who need support. Specific attention will be given to subgroups: students experiencing poverty, students with disabilities, students who are migrant or houseless.
Long-Term	RHS graduation rate will increase by 4% to 90% by 2024 -25 school year

Goal #3	Increase the number of students who are CTE concentrators, specifically in the targeted area.
Short-Term Outcome	We will increase the number of students in the targeted subgroups taking CTE courses. We know that students who take CTE courses graduate at a higher rate.
Long-Term	The number of students who are CTE concentrators will increase to 250
Outcome	students.
Goal #4	All students will be college and career ready after graduating high school. All students will create a post high school plan and have access to courses that will support their plan.
Short-Term Outcome	Implement AVID program at RHS Increase AP/CC offerings and provide support classes to ensure access by all students to advanced courses AP/CC instructional alignment and support with community and universities Increase internship opportunities for all students, including those in special education and those experiencing poverty.
