	students, but with a focus on our identified focal groups. This will allow their
	advisory teachers to move with them and track their progress from 9th grade
	through the 11th grade school years.
Long-Term	The 9th grade success team will branch out into the junior high as we build a
Outcome	network of 7th and 8th grade teachers to help build a pattern of success for 9th graders. Having our 3-tier system of support will help with identifying at-
	risk students before they get behind during the 9th grade.

Long-Term Outcome	By the end of 2024-25 all of our CTE programs and facilities will be completely up-to-date with equipment that will match industry standards.
