Lead Organization	Klamath Falls City Schools
Goal #1	Goal: 75% of students will be on-track toward graduation after completing 9th grade. .
Short-Term Outcome	Short-Term Outcome: Ninth Grade on track team (teachers, administrators and 9OT coordinator) are meeting regularly, looking at data, designing student level interventions (including our identified focal student groups), tracking supports for effectiveness and working with students and families to evaluate the supports.
Long-Term Outcome	Long-Term Outcome: The overall 9th grade on-track rate of students will increase by 10%.
Goal #2	25% of Klamath Union HS students will participate in an advanced course (AP or dual credit)
Short-Term Outcome	Counselors, Flight Time Teachers and the College and career coordinator will meet individually with each student to devise an Education Plan and Profile that identifies the student's opportunities to participate in advanced coursework. Special attention will be paid to identified student focal groups.
Long-Term Outcome	25% of KU students will participate in at least on advanced course prior to exiting high school. The rate or participation for identified focal groups will be the same or greater than the all student group.
Goal #3	80% of Klamath Falls City School district students will graduate within four years of entering high school.
Short-Term Outcome	Advisory classes (Flight Time) will monitor each student's progress toward graduation multiple times each year. Advisory teachers will coordinate with school counselors and other support staff to provide interventions for students who are at risk of not graduating.
Long-Term Outcome	KFCS will see a 10% increase in the percentage of students who graduate on time.
Dropout Prevention Activity #1	Klamath Union High School will continue work on its Ninth Grade On-Track program. This program consists of classroom teachers in various content areas who meet regularly to identify and support 9th grade students who are at risk of not being on track at the end of the 9th grade year. The team also identifies, implements and supports targeted interventions for the students that are identified. This work will continue be supported with mentoring and coaching provided by the Center for High School Success
Goal(s) this activity addresses	Goal 1
Dropout Prevention Activity #2	Klamath Learning Center will support students who have a history of school failure. Many of the student who attend Klamath Learning Center are already credit deficient. Many have experienced chronic trauma. The supports will be comprehensive and include attendance support, academic support, guidance and counseling support, support for physical and social emotional health, as well as support for post-high school, college and career options.

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Goal(s) this activity addresses	Goal 3
Dropout Prevention Activity #3	Klamath Falls City Schools will continue to implement a robust district-wide attendance initiative. This initiative has led to significant decreases in chronic absenteeism in the last few years. This initiative includes work at the building, district and community level. Strong community partnerships are in place, especially with the local juvenile justice system, to support students who struggle with school attendance. Student attendance data is reviewed regularly both at the district as well as the school level, and individual support decisions are made accordingly.
Goal(s) this activity addresses	Goal 3
College Level Opportunities Activity #1	Klamath Union High School will continue to operate a robust college and career center. The focus of the center is to support KU students as they navigate their post-high school options. Activities hosted by the center include, but are not limited to, FAFSA nights, college visits, scholarship support and Another area of focus for the CCC is to support current students in their pursuit of college credits while in high school. This includes dual-credit opportunities at Oregon Tech, Southern Oregon University and Klamath Community College as well as on campus experiences at Oregon Tech. through the Liberal Arts Academy and Klamath Community College as part of our "Pathways" program.
Goal(s) this activity addresses	Goal 2
Career Technical Education Activity #1	Klamath Union High School will continue to support three new Programs of Study within our Career Technical Education program. These include Hospitality, Media Design and Health Sciences. Based on our needs assessment, these CTE courses provide significant opportunities for students within our identified focal groups to participate in dual credit courses, especially our students with disabilities.
Goal(s) this activity addresses	Goal 2
