

High School Success Plan 2021-2023



Lead Organization	Sherman County School District
Goal #1	Maintain (if on track)/Improve grade level on track-to-graduate rates.
Short-Term Outcome	To support our goal, Sherman County School will increase the amount of inschool supports for students. These supports will include: more frequent inperson grade review meetings, more credit recovery time within the school day, more family check-ins and involvement with the shared leadership team, and more opportunities for that student to feel successful (allowing that student to mentor a younger student, assist with a lower level grade, help out within the school, and frequent positive recognition). We will also be adding a career & college readiness coordinator to ensure our students have increased support and access to individualized planning.
Long-Term Outcome	Sherman County school will have an in-place and thriving mental health team to help support students navigating mental health challenges, students experiencing family adversity, and students experiencing poverty. The career & college readiness coordinator will be able to track student's first year out from graduation and assist with future success.
Goal #2	Sherman County School will have a lower rate of chronic absenteeism.
Short-Term Outcome	The short-term outcome for reducing chronic absenteeism is to see our numbers of regular attenders after this biennium to raise to 85%, from 79% (data from the last biennium).
Long-Term Outcome	Regular attendance will increase by 8% from the previous biennium.
Dropout Prevention Activity #1	Our entire budget will go toward the employment of highly qualified mental health professionals and counseling and college and career readiness coordinator positions. Sherman County School District's shared leadership team strongly feels that the best thing we can do to assist our focal groups and students at large is to provide more connections and increase the vested interest in student success. Increasing the amount of staff will directly influence our entire 8-12 school population.
