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Organization Systems Ensuring On-time Graduation	We build each student's schedule for on track graduation. We assess students each quarter to help determine an on-track course. Students that are having difficulty are noted each week and the student and parents are communicated with. Each three weeks we assess student progress, inform both student and parents and make schedule changes as needed for a student to participate in math or literacy lab, (a course for filling in gaps, not a study hall). We are able to tailor make schedules with on-line courses and teachers teaching multiple courses the same period. We are a very small high school that stays tuned to our students.
Equitable Assignment to CTE	With only 24 students we have a place for each student in every course we offer. Each student is met with personally and we tailor the schedule and courses to meet graduation requirements and that challenge and prepare them for college, career and life ready.
Equitable Assignment to Advanced Courses	Our small high school opens all classes to all students. We encourage students to take the advanced course work and meet with their parents as well to invite them in. Our course work is intentionally inviting. We add support for all college classes so we have a 100% passage rate and a small amount of those who decide not to continue with a college course.
Systems to Address Chronic Absenteeism	Due to our size every student absent is noted. We track with parents each day. When we have a chronic illness we work with parents to get work and instruction. We have an excellent attendance rate.
Teacher Collaboration Time	We have at two monthly staff meetings. At least once a month students grades and absences are brought up but this can happen at any of the meetings. Three week progress reports filled out by the teachers are brought by the superintendent.
Teacher Access to Data	The data on student assessment is the key area to gain expertise. We will put this on the staff development list for the future.
