

High School Success Plan 2021-2023



Lead	Tillamook School District #9
Organization Goal #1	90% of students will be on-track toward graduation after completing 9th grade.
Short-Term Outcome	Ninth grade success teams (teachers and relevant support staff) are meeting regularly, looking at data with a focus on our identified focal groups, student supports are tracked for effectiveness (PDSA cycles) and students and families are involved in the evaluation of those supports.
Long-Term Outcome	The overall 9th grade on-track rate of students will increase by 10% yearly across all demographics, with an emphasis on our identified focal students.
Goal #2	95% of students will be considered Regular Attenders.
Short-Term Outcome	The ABS teams (admin, counselors, and relevant support staff) are meeting regularly, looking at data with a focus on our identified focal groups, student supports are tracked for effectiveness and families are engaged in meaningful ways.
Long-Term	The overall chronic absentee rate will decrease by 18% especially in our focal groups
Outcome Goal #3	Students with disabilities, students navigating houselessness and foster care,
Goal #3	and students experiencing poverty will graduate at the same rate as their peers.
Short-Term Outcome	Teachers commit to improving instruction through intentional Professional Development in Sheltered Instruction Strategies and commit to using data to systematically drive instructional decisions in the classroom. THS will provide a variety of electives connected to College and Career Technical Education. THS will partner with outside entities to ensure students' basic needs are being met.
Long-Term Outcome	Student enrollment in CTE concentrators will rise by 25% with the largest increases seen in focal student groups identified in the district needs assessment.
Dropout Prevention Activity #1	Utilize the Campus Connections Coach and District Family Resource Coordinator to connect families with resources to support student's basic needs to improve attendance.

Dropout Prevention Activity #4	Tillamook will hire a full time Mental Health Counselor for Tillamook Junior High, Tillamook High School and our Alternative School. The District will also hire a .5 FTE High School Dean of Students to support graduation rates within targeted groups: Students experiencing poverty, homelessness, foster care, and students with disabilities

College Level Opportunities Activity #1	The College and Career Counselor will meet with every student multiple times a year to go over post-secondary goals and will take students on College visits.

Career Technical Education Activity #1	Student engagement is a high priority. All 9th grade students will be required to take 1.0 credits in CTE programs, specifically targeting students with disabilities and Ever ELLs.
