

ORS 329.451/SB 222 Guidance

Senate Bill 222 was enacted in 2013 by the Oregon Legislature. The bill revises ORS 329.451 and provides directives to those **school districts that require** <u>more than 24 total credits</u> for **the diploma.** If the district requires more than 24 credits, the additional credits must be in courses that:

- align to the academic content standards adopted by the State Board of Education;
- are part of a career and technical education program (CTE); or
- provide, or qualify to provide, credit at post-secondary institutions.

These directives apply to students graduating on or after July 1, 2015.

These directives only apply to the additional credits required above and beyond the state-required 24 credits.

Oregon Revised Statute 329.045 lists the subjects that the State Board of Education is responsible for adopting academic content standards. These subjects are: mathematics, science, English, history, geography, economics, civics, physical education, health, the arts and world languages.

Courses that might not qualify for the additional required credits are (titles are from the current NCES course codes): Standardized Test Preparation, State Test Preparation, Study Skills, Tutorial, Study Hall, Office Aide, Guidance Aide, Library Aide, Leadership, School Orientation, Community Service, Values Clarification, Seminar. If these courses are tied to a CTE course of study, or are aligned to academic content standards, or provide community college, university, or apprenticeship credit, they could be used to satisfy the additional credits.
