The survey to decide the date will be re-sent out as a reminder and the deadline extended for responses.</p> <p>Discussion around the draft SICC 2016-2017 schedule occurred. The November date was changed due to the ELD COSA Conference which was the same date as the November 18th. The rescheduled meeting will now be held Thursday, November 10th.</p>	
9:30 - 9:45	SICC Committee Updates	<p>The SICC has been unsuccessful for scheduling a time with Lindsey Capps to deliver the Governor's Report. Nancy Johnson-Dorn will be meeting with Salam Noor, Superintendent of Public Instruction who meets often with Lindsey Capps to facilitate a meeting for the SICC to deliver the report to him on behalf of Governor Brown.</p> <p>Membership Committee and LICC Retreat Committees will be breaking out at the conclusion of the meetings to discuss strategies moving forward.</p>	
9:45 - 10:00	State Systemic Improvement Plan (SSIP) (Mandy Stanley)	<p>Mandy Stanley, ODE, spoke about the State Systemic Improvement Plan (SSIP). During the last SICC meeting the group was asked about tools they were using. Two suggestions were recommended: a parent evaluation tool and CLASS, a teacher observation tool. She was unable to find anything for parent evaluation tool. When researching CLASS it was found that it was not a tool that would fit specific needs for our work on the SSIP. A team is looking for further measures collaboration with WESD to address social emotional and approaches to learning. It was asked if SEAM was looked at. Mandy will connect with Jantina Clifford (SICC Member) about this evaluation. Social Emotional groups are using the T-Pot evaluation. ODE is trying to look at measures that</p>	

		<p>programs are already using. They are also looking at measure for child outcomes behavior and skills, and looking at specific teacher behaviors that are not on CLASS or T-Pot. Items are being pulled from AEPS because teachers are already doing this so that another layer isn't added. More information will be coming in the fall.</p>	
10:00 - 10:15	TSPC License Realignment Update (Jantina Clifford)	<p>Jantina Clifford, SICC Member, spoke about the letter of support that was sent to Teachers Standards and Practices (TSPC) regarding changes to early childhood program licensures. Conversations occurred around next steps. The higher education consortium feels the next steps are to lobby Oregon Legislatures to extend TSPC's Authority to "B-5" (change Oregon statute) and lobby to ODE to "address the issue through policy routes".</p> <p>The group feels that since Oregon has a unique seamless system from birth to age 5 therefore the group feels they need to do what is right for this state. It was also recommended the SICC members would like to set up a meeting with SICC member Senator Gelser to address their concerns about this change.</p> <p>The higher education consortium would like to bring more people into the group who have expertise. SACSE member agreed to create a task force to work on how to move the work forward. They have not met yet. Rebecca Shultz was going to take the lead on this work. It was felt this group should form outside the higher education consortium group and include the higher education group in discussion.</p> <p>There are other agencies that are also concerned about this outside of the issue. Letters are being sent from CSAC and early child education workgroup according to Laurie Theodorou. It was recommended to have someone from CSAC to connect to the SICC/SACSE workgroup. Next step is for SICC to check in with Senator Gelser to meet with the subgroup and ask her how to move forward. The group will look at the Statute with Holly Reed Schindler with ODE to get facts straight before moving forward.</p> <p>Carol Moore will connect the SICC with SACSE to collaborate.</p> <p>Jantina will email Rebecca with SACSE to update her with what was spoken at the SICC meeting.</p>
