School Re-opening/Closing Plan

Limited In Person Instruction

All school buildings are currently hosting LIPI. Depending on their schedule (AM or PM group), students are given breakfast or lunch on campus. The other meal (breakfast or lunch) and supper are offered to them as they leave for the day.

Drive Through Grab and Go

Lebanon High School, Lacombe School, Hamilton Creek School, Riverview School and Seven Oak School are all open during designated times for drive through meals for students not able to pick up meals during LIPI and for siblings and other community children.

Return To In-person or Hybrid Instruction

Tentative Return to in person instruction pending meeting advisory metrics:

March 8th-All K-8 students return Monday-Friday 8:00-1:00 or 9:00-3:00 for in person instruction- Cascades School, Green Acres School, Hamilton Creek School, Lacombe School, Riverview and Pioneer School, Seven Oak School (10:00-4:00, A & B Cohorts, M,T & TH, F)

March 15th-Lebanon High School returns. Students will be divided into cohorts. A will attend M & T. B will attend Th, F. Students will do online core courses in the mornings and will come into the buildings each day at 12:25. LIPI students will continue to be in the building each morning and will be served breakfast at 8:45 am.

**All students will have the option to remain in Comprehensive Distance Learning

Nutrition Procedures for In Person/Hybrid Instruction

March 8th-**K-8 students, receiving on site instruction, will be given a bagged breakfast upon entry into the building. Modified O vs. S for milk will be used. Each school will have a designated plan of where those students will be eating. Most will be directed directly to their classroom. Some may be directed to an alternate place, such as a gym with tables.

They will be served a lunch at school. Modified O vs. S for milk will be used. They will come to the cafeteria to get their meal. Each building will have a designated eating place. Most will return to the classroom, but some may eat in gyms that have been set up with tables. Of course, social distancing measures will be observed for both breakfast and lunch.

****All grab and go curbside service will be discontinued at the K-8 buildings at this point. Those are Hamilton Creek, Lacombe and Riverview and Seven Oak. Grab and Go curbside service will continue at Lebanon High School until the week of March 15th.**

Lebanon High School will continue curbside grab and go.

March 15th-Lebanon High School students return. Grab and go curbside is discontinued. Students will be given a grab and go breakfast upon entry to the building. They will be directed to their designated eating area. Most likely their classroom.

LHS student will remain in Comprehensive Distance Learning in the mornings. They will be divided into 2 cohorts. A will attend M & T. B will attend TH & F. They will enter the building at 12:25 at designated entrances. Lunch will be offered to them at the entrances. From there, they will be directed to their eating spot in the commons or gym observing social distancing.

Weekly Meal Box Ordering

Week of February 22nd-We will reach out to families in the Lacombe and Hamilton Creek area to have them sign up for weekly meal box ordering. Families will have the option to order breakfast and lunch for siblings and community children not attending school. They will have the option to order suppers (CACFP) for all students. These meals will also be available for Saturday and Sunday. Times will be designated for pick up for these boxes. If someone comes to a designated pick up time that is not signed up, we will serve them and assist with sign up information. The reason for targeting Lacombe and Hamilton Creek specifically is that they are rural schools and it may prohibit access to meals if they have to drive into town to pick up meals.

We will begin to target the balance of the schools for sign up the same week. All of these schools will have access to grab and go service at LHS during sign ups. We will continue to post signs alerting parents they cannot receive duplicate meals.

Boxes will most likely be made available for pick up at LHS and Seven Oak on Wednesdays due to them not having school those days, but we will be flexible about pick up locations to accommodate families.

We will work toward pick up times at Lacombe and Hamilton creek for families living in those areas.

We will work with families who can't pick up boxes during designated pick up times. We may be able to provide an alternate pick time and location.

Once we are doing on site instruction, we will use home deliveries as a last resort. We will lose the staffing currently available (bus drivers) to do this.

Return to Comprehensive Distance Learning

Grab and go curbside service will begin when an entire building is returned to Comprehensive Distance Learning (CDL) due to a COVID19 exposure. Anyone receiving weekly boxes will only be eligible to pick up meals they would have received at school.

Families of single classes returned to CDL due to a COVID exposure may be contacted to see if they need meals. Grab and go will not resume when single classes are returned to CDL.

Outreach

Notices of meal box availability will be made through our district messaging system, posting on FaceBook, posting on our website and via flyers distributed with our grab and go meals during transition time.

Secretarial staff, Nutrition Staff and the Welcome Center staff all can assist families with filling out requests for meal boxes.

Integrity

1. Signs will continue to be posted at each grab and go site prohibiting duplicate meals during transition to ordered meal boxes.
2. Family requests for meal boxes will be cross referenced with enrollment records to ensure duplicate meals are not given. Example: Students attending a M, T cohort will only be eligible for 3-4 days of lunches and breakfasts. Students attending M-F will only be eligible for 2 days of lunch and breakfast (weekends). All students will be eligible for suppers as we are not serving those on site to begin with.
