Carryover and Transfers for Expanded Income Eligibility Revised March 20, 2020

Carryover

Carryover occurs at the beginning of the school year. Eligibility from the previous school year is carried over to the new school year for the first 30 operating days (day meals are served) or until a new eligibility determination is made for the current school year, whichever comes.

Moving within or between LEAs to a school using *Expanded Income by applications* – LEA may carry over children's eligibility for paid meals at no charge (Oregon Paid) for up to 30 operating days or until a new eligibility determination is made for the current school year, whichever comes first.

No carryover needed. Meals allocated on percent to total.

to Expanded Income by Census

No carryover needed. Meals allocated on percent to total.

to Federal Program

No carryover. Oregon Paid eligibility not accepted; student is in federal paid category. State-wide charge policy in effect. Family responsible for paid meal cost.

to Provision 2 School, Expanded Income Guideline by Application or Census

In Base Year, provisional school tracking EIG certified students. EIG certification carries over for up to 30 operating days or until a new determination for the school year.

In Non Base Year, no documentation needed. Meal allocated by Base Year participation %.

Expanded Income by Census (paid meal at no charge; no FSFS certification)

to Expanded Income by Application

LEA may count paid meals at no charge (Oregon Paid) for up to 30 operating days or until a new eligibility determination is made for the current school year, whichever comes first.

to Community Eligibility Provision

Meal at no charge. No carryover needed. Meals allocated on percent to total.

to Expanded Income by Census

Meal at no charge. No carryover needed. Meals allocated on percent to total.

to Provision 2 School, Expanded Income Guideline by Application or Census

In Base Year, counted in paid category until a new determination for the school year.

In Non Base Year, no documentation needed. Meal allocated by Base Year participation %.

to Federal Program

No carryover. Oregon Paid eligibility not accepted; student is in federal paid category. State-wide charge policy in effect. Family responsible for paid meal cost.

Transfers

Transfers happen during the school year when a child moves to another school during the school year. When the transfer is outside the LEA, the receiving LEA is encouraged to obtain eligibility documentation from sending LEA to maintain continuity of meal access for the student. Email with student name and status is adequate documentation (SP51-2016).

No documentation needed. Meals at no charge. Counted in Paid category. FSFS Meals allocated on percent to total paid

to Provision 2 School, Expanded Income Guideline by Application or Census

In Base Year, provisional school tracking EIG certified students.

Within LEA – Eligibility moves with child.

Outside LEA — Receiving LEA may accept children's eligibility for paid meals at no charge (Oregon Paid) from sending LEA.

In Non Base Year, no documentation needed. Meal allocated by Base Year participation %.

to Federal Program

Oregon Paid eligibility not accepted; student is in federal paid category. State-wide charge policy in effect. Family responsible for paid meal cost.

Expanded Income by Census

to Expanded Income by Application

LEA may count paid meals at no charge (Oregon Paid) for up to 30 operating days or until a new eligibility determination is made, whichever comes first.

No documentation needed. Meals allocated on percent to total.

to Expanded Income by Census

No documentation needed. Meals allocated on percent to total.

to Provision 2 School, Expanded Income Guideline by Application or Census

In Base Year, counted in paid category until a new determination for the school year.

In Non Base Year, no documentation needed. Meal allocated by Base Year participation %.

to Federal Program

Oregon Paid eligibility not accepted; student is in federal paid category. State-wide charge policy in effect. Family responsible for paid meal cost.

Visiting

A visiting student is one eligible to participate in school nutrition programs and is visiting a school on an infrequent basis.

Meals served to a paid student from Expanded Income by Census visiting an Expanded Income by Application school may be served meals at no charge and counted in the federal Paid and Oregon Paid categories.

Meals served to a paid student from either Expanded Income by Census or Expanded Income by Application school visiting a federal program only may be served meals at no charge and counted in the paid category. The meal cost is the responsibility of the student's family or sending school.

Students from a federal program only visiting a school receiving state FSFS funds and on provision 2 are served the meal at no charge. The meals are counted according to USDA Provision 2 guidance.
