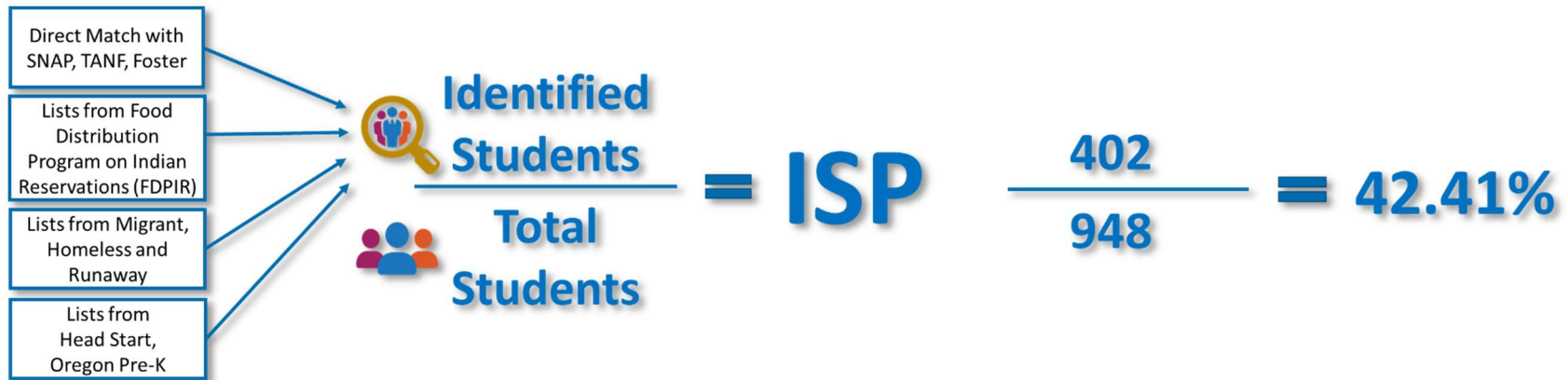


How the Identified Student Percentage (ISP) is calculated



The Community Eligibility Provision is available to qualified individual schools, groups of schools, and entire districts. To qualify for CEP, the “Identified Student Percentage” must be 40% or more.

Students qualify as “identified students” when they are participating in the following service programs:

SNAP, TANF, FDPIR, Homeless, Migrant, Foster, Runaway, Head Start, Oregon Pre-K, Administrative Applications*.

Student data used for the calculation must be as of the April 1 enrollment of the school year prior to starting CEP.

**Note: Administrative Applications refer to non-applicant students approved by local education officials, such as a principal, based on available information.*

Identified Students, the numerator, is the sum of the students in the categories listed on the left of the graphic in the sites electing CEP

Total Students, the denominator, are all enrolled students, including Pre-K children, with access to at least one meal in the sites electing CEP

The ratio of Identified Students to Total students, x 100, is the **ISP**. The ISP can be representative of a single site or group or sites.
