9:00: Introductions- <i>Welcome, Jennifer Fontana</i>	Meeting Recorded for note taking purposes.
9:15-9:45: Title III immigrant subgrants- Mary Martinez-Wenzl,	Kim Miller and Reza Norouzian- provided an overview of the Immigrant Grant Funds and the multilingual and various. Funding that supports our multilingual English Learners in Oregon.
Reza Norouzian, Kim Miller	Title III immigrant subgrants and Oregon's current practice of reserving 0.5% for these grants by law this amount could be up to 15%. These per pupil numbers are based on 2022-23 numbers and are submit to change based on student counts in the corresponding data collection.
	Currently Oregon has 11 consortia located around the state.
	Questions: Will Districts have to apply to a separate Title III Immigrant grant with this revision or will it just be added to the Title III Budget Narrative regular year?
	Immigrant grant is a separate grant based on the data in the recent arrivals data collection. It has a separate budget narrative application
	Do you have a reference for the "approximately 3 districts" budgets?
	These districts typically receive a Title III budget between \$11,000 and \$13,000 with the current Title III Immigrant set aside of .5%. Depending on change in the Title III Immigrant set aside percentage and number of students in the EL grant per student allocations, these districts could fall below the \$10,000 Title III regular school year funding threshold.
	Do their current Title III allocations represent a substantial portion of their budgets?

This amount is their total Title III federal allocation, these districts would also have state EL weighted funding. There are approximately 85 identified multilingual students in these districts.

I am guessing they are small and rural... Would those potential districts be close to local consortia? Not all of these districts are small and rural, they include ones in the Willamette Valley, Portland metro as well as more rural locations. There are consortia across the state, however not always are they "close", for example Lakeview SD is a member of SOESD consortia as that is the closest consortia opportunity.

Are these districts likely to change? By change, I'm assuming you mean will their population change. These districts have had similar multilingual English Learner counts consistently for the past several years. Like all districts, the population could change, but that has not been observed thus far.

Collaborative Engagement with Community

- Redesigning the Kindergarten Assessment as center equity
- Community engagement in co-creation, a reimagined process

Suggested Questions:

Collaboration or input special education had on the early transition.

How do wonder about if there's opportunity for shared relationship building Related to culture, why? Where are things important in your culture?

While we think these are valuable for educators to ask for their purpose of building relationships. Versions of these questions could be great as follow up questions for the question, "What else would you like me to know about your child?"

How will Kindergarten teachers be asked to record and share responses? And are teachers/districts sharing responses with ODE only during the pilot?

Educators will be provided a note taking form and which they can then transfer to a data input Smartsheet. ODE will compile and analyze. Our researchers are learning best tools to assist with data analysis and will continue the process this coming Fall.

We were able to provide a stipend to both families and educators who participated in these conversational feedback sessions.

Engagement with university faculty and selecting and analyzing the data.

We have three researchers developing a session for early learning.
