## **Statement of Purpose:**

The Latino/a/x and Indigenous Student Success Advisory Group supports the development and implementation of the Latino/a/x and Indigenous Student Success Plan. The Advisory Group will partner with the Office of Equity, Diversity and Inclusion Initiatives (OEDII) at the Oregon Department of Education (ODE) to provide guidance on educational issues affecting Latino/a/x students and families. The Advisory Group will share their collective experiences, histories, and wisdom to help ODE and Oregon's school districts to ensure Latino/a/x students thrive.

The Advisory Group supports these efforts in three important ways:

- Give guidance to OEDII staff in developing, revising, updating, and implementing the Latino/a/x and Indigenous Student Success Plan.
- Give guidance to OEDII staff in creating and updating priorities, eligibility and selection criteria for the Latino/a/x and Indigenous Student Success Grants.
- Give guidance to OEDII staff for the development, revision, and implementation of policy, including Oregon Administrative Rules, and practices that support the achievement of the Latino/a/x Student Success Plan.

### Membership:

The department shall form an advisory group consisting of individuals representing:

- Urban and rural communities;
- Indigenous and immigrant populations;
- English language learners;
- Individuals with disabilities;
- Parents and students;
- Youth who are lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer or another minority gender or sexual orientation;
- Community-based organizations serving Latino or Hispanic youth and families; and
- Educators, including representatives of the Department of Early Learning and Care, the Youth Development Division and the Higher Education Coordinating Commission.

Advisory Group will consist of up to 20 members with equitable representation from the required demographic categories.

### Responsibilities of members:

Advisory Group members will:

- Attend and participate in advisory meetings. Meetings will typically be held virtually to allow for full participation of Advisory members across the state.
- Represent their local communities and share their priorities, issues, and/or concerns with the Advisory Group.
- Report back to their local communities about topics and issues discussed in the Advisory Group.

- Review minutes and materials prior to meetings.
- Communicate with ODE staff if you anticipate missing one or more meetings in order to support continued participation.

Advisory members may be asked to step down if they miss three consecutive meetings.

### Meetings:

Advisory Group will meet monthly from September to June. Meetings last approximately 2 hours on the 3rd Tuesday of the month; additional meetings may be requested in special circumstances. Meetings are held remotely with an annual in-person retreat taking place in September of each year.

### **Membership Terms of Service:**

Advisory members can serve up to two 2-year terms. No person may be appointed to serve consecutively more than two full terms as an Advisory member.

### **Conflicts of interest:**

Advisory members will be asked to declare any and all potential conflicts of interest. All Advisory Group members will submit a conflict of interest form upon accepting their membership. Conflicts of interest include place of employment, volunteer or board positions, close family members connected to potential grantee organizations, etc.
