HB 3499 English Learner Outcomes

Background:

After presenting to the State Board of Education this past October 22, 2015, the State Board made clear to support districts that have less than 20 English language learners.

Project: Building Capacity with School Districts with less than twenty English Learners.

The Goals:

Increase the capacity for these districts in the areas of language acquisition, best program practices and supports for English learners and their families.

To bring together teams of educators and administrators from these districts to learn more deeply about the critical role of building capacity around English proficiency and using the English Proficiency Standards. This will be learning by doing, since the training revolves around learning about and building by sharing best practices.

Who should attend: K-12 teachers, Counselors, Special Education teachers, and District Office Directors and Coordinators. It is suggested that a team of at least five participants should be in these professional developments.

What will the professional development cover?

Implementation of the English language proficiency standards.

Language District policy.

Revision of the District English learner plan.

Data revision of the District's English learners.

Creating a network of professionals in the area of English learners. Working with the ESD Consortium and the network of Districts with reduced numbers of English learners.

Building parent capacity.

Ensure access and opportunity for middle and high school students.
