The statewide LGBTQ2SIA+ Student Success Plan, which was adopted by the Oregon State Board of Education, recommends an Inclusive Curriculum objective that asserts, "students experience LGBTQ2SIA+ inclusive, affirming, and culturally sustaining curriculum and pedagogy across grades and subjects" (Student Success Plan Domain 2, Objective 2, Strategy 1, Action 1a-b).
