	No additional funding for the Latinx Student Success plan. For the next biennium the 6 million for Latinx will need to be spread 6 million over 2 years instead of 1 year. The plan was to fund the current grantees at their current service level for an additional year and the additional funding would be used to launch a new RFA. This will change as soon as we get confirmation on exactly how much funding the Latinx program will receive.
