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Restoration Fundraisers



- 1. A bake sale was held that lasted two days and every item cost \$3. If 20 baked goods were sold the first day and 10 baked goods were sold the second day, how much money was made during that fundraiser?
- 2. Children were often sent out to pick blackberries and huckleberries in the woods to make jam. This jam was then sold or used as a topping for frybread. If one gallon jug of huckleberries could be sold for \$10 and 7 children each picked a gallon jug, how much money would the children make that day?
- 3. Bottle/Can returns were another fundraiser often used. People of Grand Ronde would save up their cans and bottles for the Restoration Committee to collect and deposit for money. If the Committee had a goal to raise \$25 by returning cans and bottles, and each can/bottle was worth ¢5, how many cans/bottles would they need to turn in?
- 4. Another fundraiser the people of Grand Ronde often held were frybread sales. These sales usually included selling pieces of frybread covered with berry jam along the highway. One day while out selling frybread, Mr. Colton was able to sell 12 pieces of frybread! If every piece of frybread cost \$3, how much money was Mr. Colton able to raise that day?

BONUS: What if every piece had cost \$4? How much money would he have made then?
