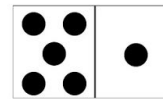
Federal AI/AN and State AI/AN+ based on 2022-23 Data / Title VI based on 2023-2024

General Title VI Timeline

>\$40K - Have you engaged in Meaningful and Ongoing Collaboration with your designated Tribal Partner(s) for Title VI?

- EASIE APR for FY 22-23 opens 9/11
- Indian Parent Committee Start of Year Outreach
- District and School-Wide Registration Norming - 506

SEPTEMBER

- Share State Assessment results with IPC, LEA community, and Indian Tribes whose community is served by the LEA
- Tribal Consultation and Meaningful and Ongoing Collaboration Review and Monitoring is occurring

NOVEMBER/DECEMBER

- IPC Bylaws must be established for new sites.
- EASIE PART I Closes March 8
- Engage in Tribal Consultation or Meaningful and Ongoing Collaboration
- Hold a Public Hearing

MARCH

- Send Final EASIE Part II Application to OIE prior to sending to US DOE
- EASIE PART II Submission closes May 10.

MAY

OCTOBER

- EASIE APR for FY 22-23 closes 10/13
- Possible 31 day count window

JANUARY/FEBRUARY

- Possible 31 day count window
- Conduct Needs Assessment
- Seek Indian Parent Committee Approval (LEAs and Consortiums)
- EASIE PART 1 Opens Feb 5

APRIL

- EASIE PART II Application opens April 1
- Indian Parent Committee completes Application Approval Form
- IPC Chairperson/Designee makes attestations.

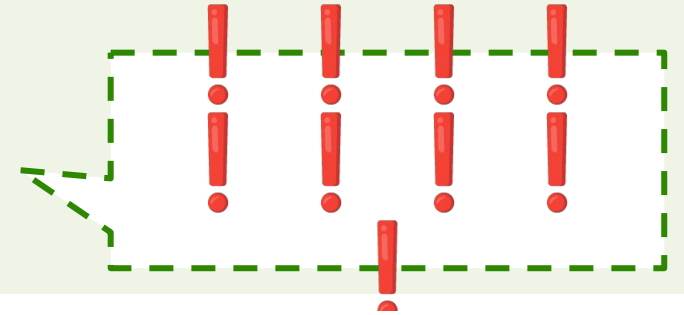
This is a general visual of the Title VI school year timeline. All LEAs and LEA-Cs should adhere to all published DOE timelines to plan their efforts.

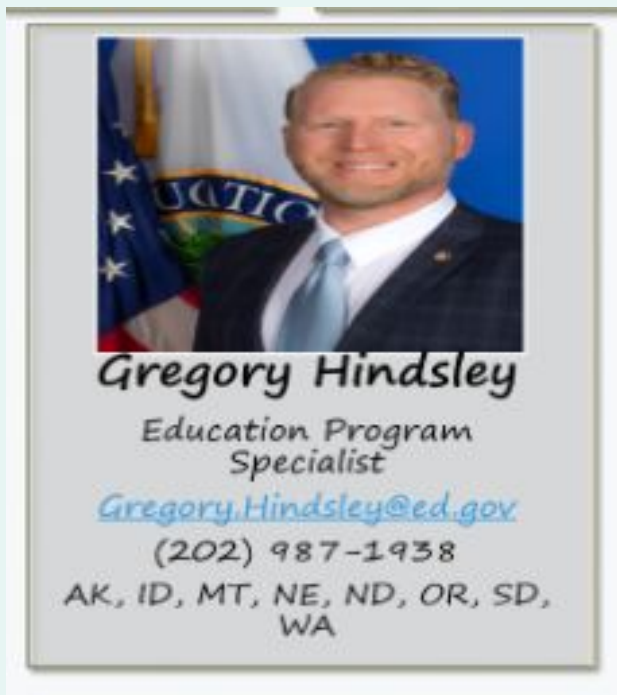
