3. Based on the journal entries written by women traveling on the Oregon Trail, how did the women on the trail feel about their interactions with Native Americans? What emotions were they experiencing? How do you know?

4. Based on the journal entries written by women traveling on the Oregon Trail, why did the women think poorly of the Native Americans?
5. Give one example of a woman on the Oregon Trail who thought fondly of the Native Americans she met.
6. How are the readings the same (kakwa)?
7. How are the readings different (xluyma)?
