	OAR recap: Needed before we can release an RFA and start the process of getting grants distributed.	
	We are defining things so that we have a shared understanding. If there are organizations that don't have things in place already to support NHPI students and families, they might apply for a grant to begin that work but say that they are already doing it. We need to make sure that the funds that are released are given to organizations that do work that supports specifically students that we stand for. We could potentially fund an organization that serves more than NHPI students so funds would not be directed specifically to our students. How do we ensure that, as much as possible, we are addressing the population we want to reach?	
	We also need to have an intersectional framework so we can center who is most harmed among us when it comes to specific issues surrounding the advocacy for our students. Mental health disparities are also a huge concern (especially for QTPIs). We need to be cognizant of resource allocation and the scarcity mindset.	
	Disaggregated/differentiated data is an ongoing issue. In the state of Oregon, we have to define Pacific Islander which is a big conversation. There is power behind acronyms - there is erasure when populations are lumped together.
