# Requirements for District Safety, Alcohol, Tobacco and Other Drug and Violence Prevention Plans

Districts are required to have plans around Drug and Violence prevention. These plans are required by different laws and have common elements. In an effort to help streamline the planning processes and to identify the specific elements that meet the legal requirements, this instrument was developed. This instrument identifies the elements required to meet the planning provisions of the federal No Child Left Behind Act: (Title IV part A Safe and Drug-free Schools and Communities), Oregon Administrative Rule 581-022-1420 (School Safety Plan) and Oregon Administrative Rule 581-022-0413 (Prevention Education Programs in Drugs and Alcohol).

In identifying the common elements, a planning framework emerged that includes:

- Needs/Resource Assessment and Analysis
- Performance Measures and Evaluation
- Policies and Procedures
- School Climate and Instruction
- Student Support Services
- Coordination/Communication/Outreach/Family Involvement
- Staff Development

This instrument is intended to help districts ensure that all drug and violence prevention planning requirements are met. The instrument may provide a framework for coordinated planning.
