SUMMARY

This agenda item is to provide the Board with an update on the Fire Program Review Committee's progress to-date and to provide a revised committee charter (Attachment 1).

CONTEXT

Due to the significant increase in wildfires over the past several years, the Oregon Department of Forestry (ODF) initiated a Fire Program Review Committee December 2015. This committee is made up of forest landowners, wildland fire professionals, elected officials, the Oregon State Fire Marshal's office and other stakeholders to advise ODF in its effort to develop and implement a more sustainable fire organization, including large-fire funding solutions, and developing policy options to mitigate increasingly complex wildfire conditions in Oregon.

BACKGROUND

The Fire Program Review Committee has conducted two meetings to-date: December 1, 2015 and January 21, 2016. The committee has established three "Working Groups" which is conducting much of the staff work necessary for the committee to deliberate on its mission. The three working groups' status as of the March 9 Board of Forestry meeting are detailed as follows:

- Sustainable Large-Fire Funding Working Group: This working group will have conducted three meetings and is focusing on a series of recommendations to address the large-fire funding challenges, as we plan for the future of the state's protection system. Focus areas include the interplay between OFLFP, Insurance, and the General Fund, along with discussions regarding new revenue sources and development of a Trust Fund dedicated to large fire costs.
- Sustainable Fire Organization Working Group: This working group will have conducted two meetings and continues its effort on seeking greater effectiveness in the protection system and considering investments in the protection system under four categories: Workforce Capacity, Equipment and Technology, Training and Readiness, and Contracting.
- Wildfire Policy Working Group: This working group will have conducted one meeting and will begin to define its scope of work. This groups' lense will be focused on complex natural resouces issues related to wildfire and may take more time to synthesize and define its anticipated outcomes for the overall committee work.

RECOMMENDATION

The department recommends the Board continue to support and participate in the Fire Program Review Committee.

- Sustainable Large-Fire Funding Working Group meets next on April 8, 2016.
