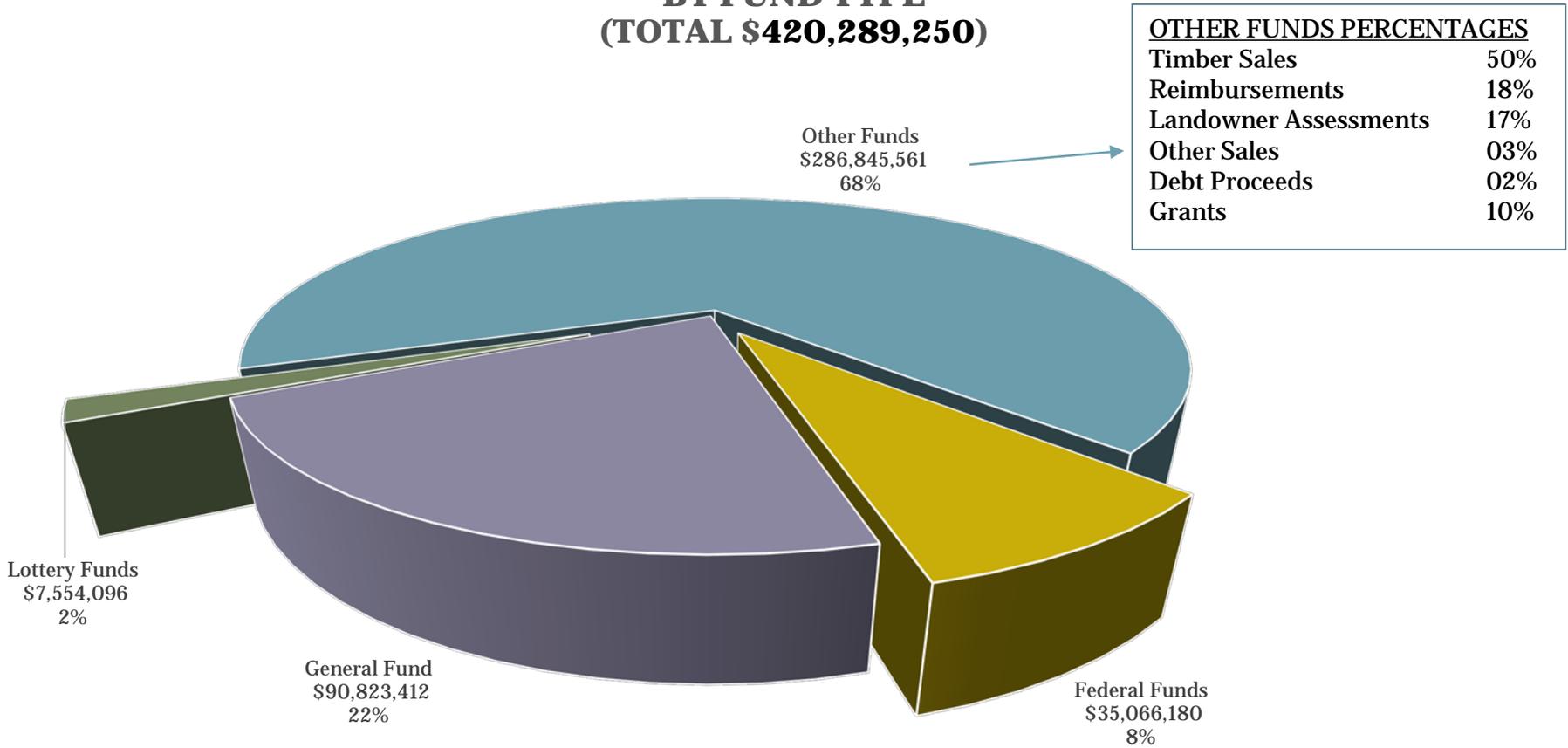

(TOTAL \$420,289,250)**



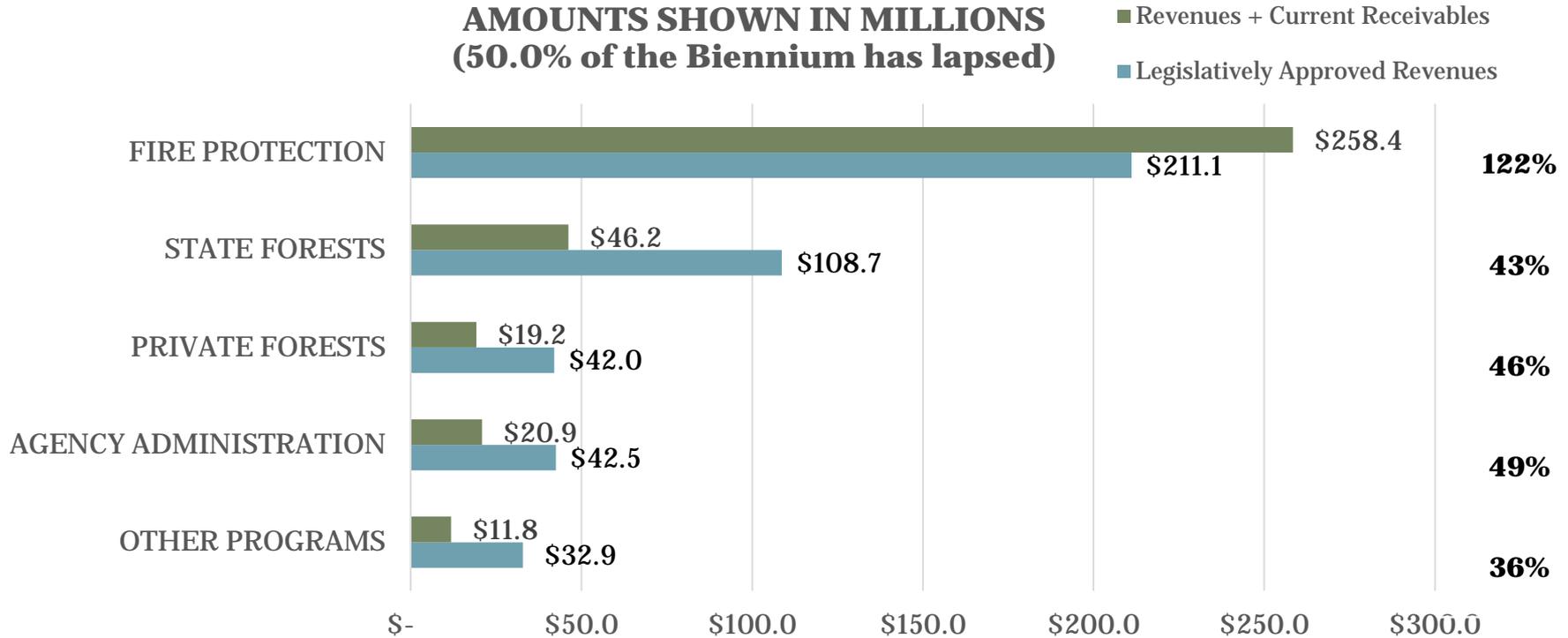

Fire Protection's revenues do not include an outstanding \$30 million loan but do include receivables due from Fire Season 2015.

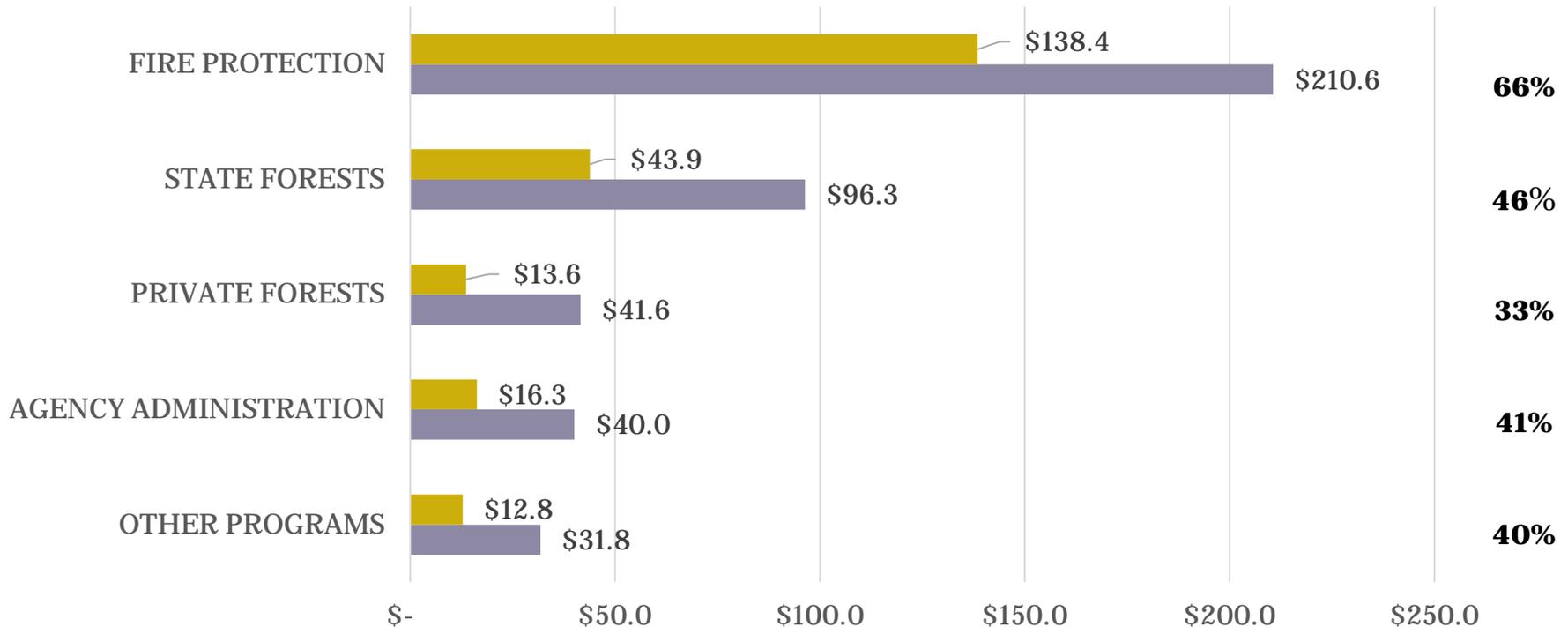

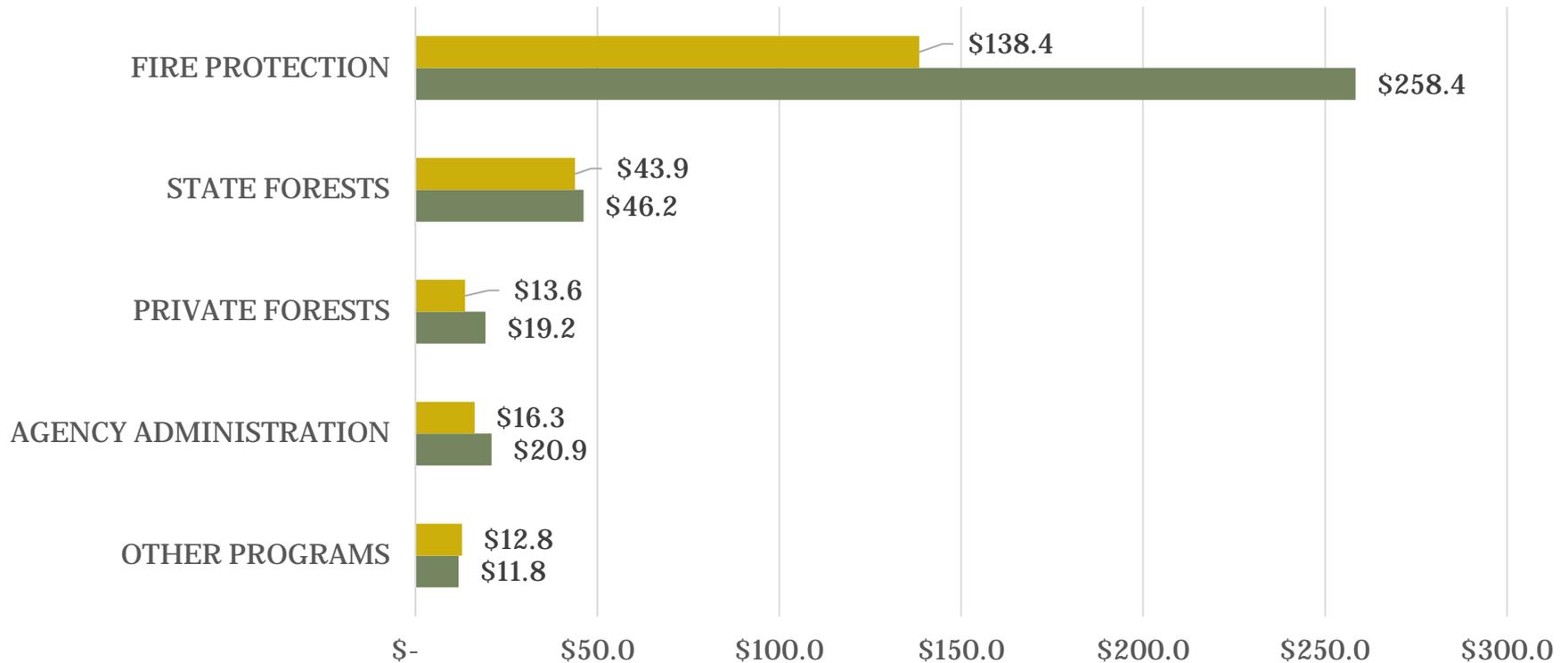

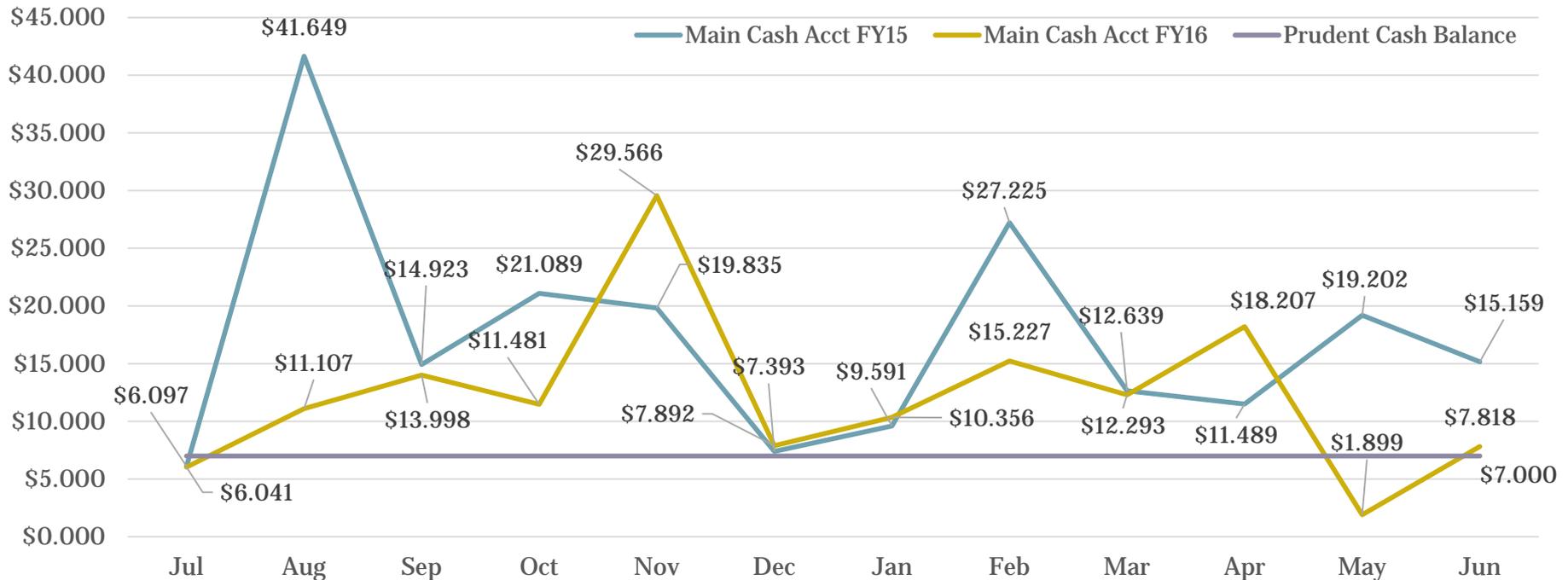


AMOUNT SPENT TO DATE VERSUS ACCRUED REVENUES TO DATE

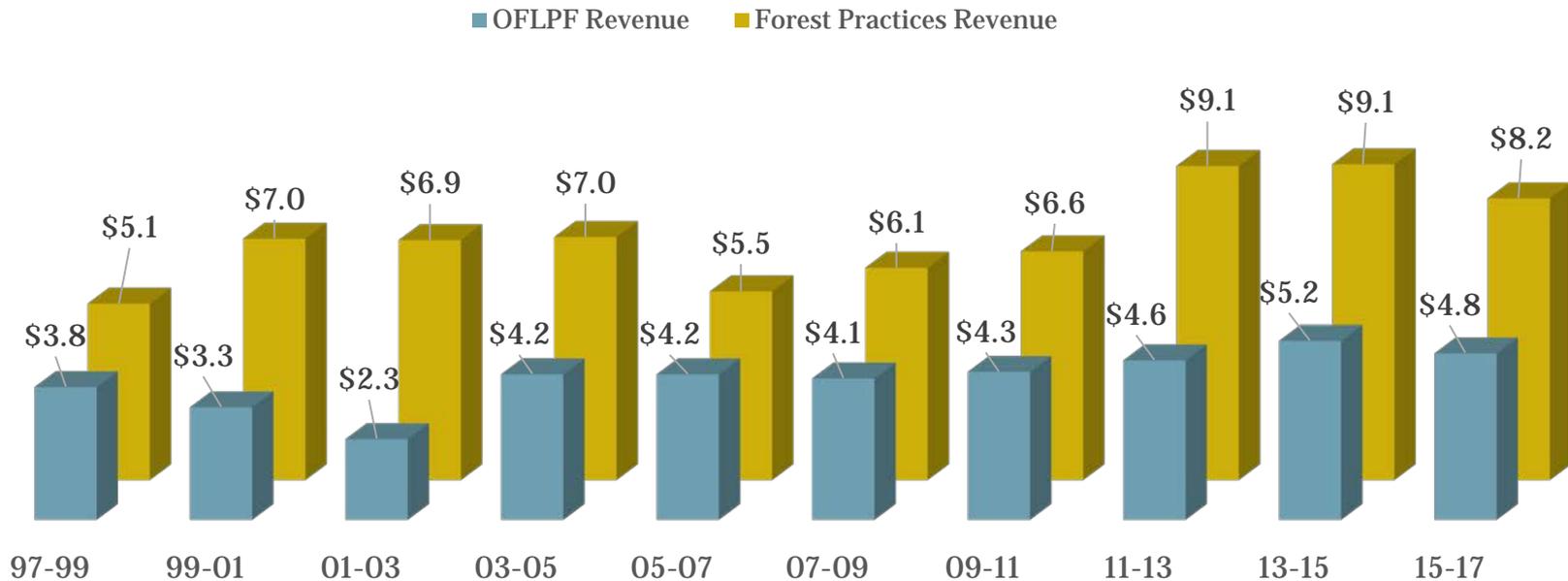


CASH BALANCE IN MAIN CASH ACCOUNT

Shows the final cash balance at the end of the month over the last fiscal year in comparison to current fiscal year on a monthly basis. This account is where the cash for all major programs of the Department are kept. There are normal dips in July, October, January and April from timber revenues shared with counties. October FY15 and February FY15 increases are from monies brought in from the credit line with Treasury and the large increase in August FY15 is due to the receipt of a FEMA prepayment of \$27 million and the line of credit which was not paid back until September FY15. The increase in November FY16 was due to the receipt of Protection assessments and the payment from BLM to Protection. The decrease in May FY16 was from ODF payback of a \$25 million Treasury loan. The line of credit was fully paid back in June 2016. A new credit line was established in July 2016..

OREGON DEPARTMENT OF FORESTRY TIMBER HARVEST TAX REVENUES AMOUNTS SHOWN IN MILLIONS

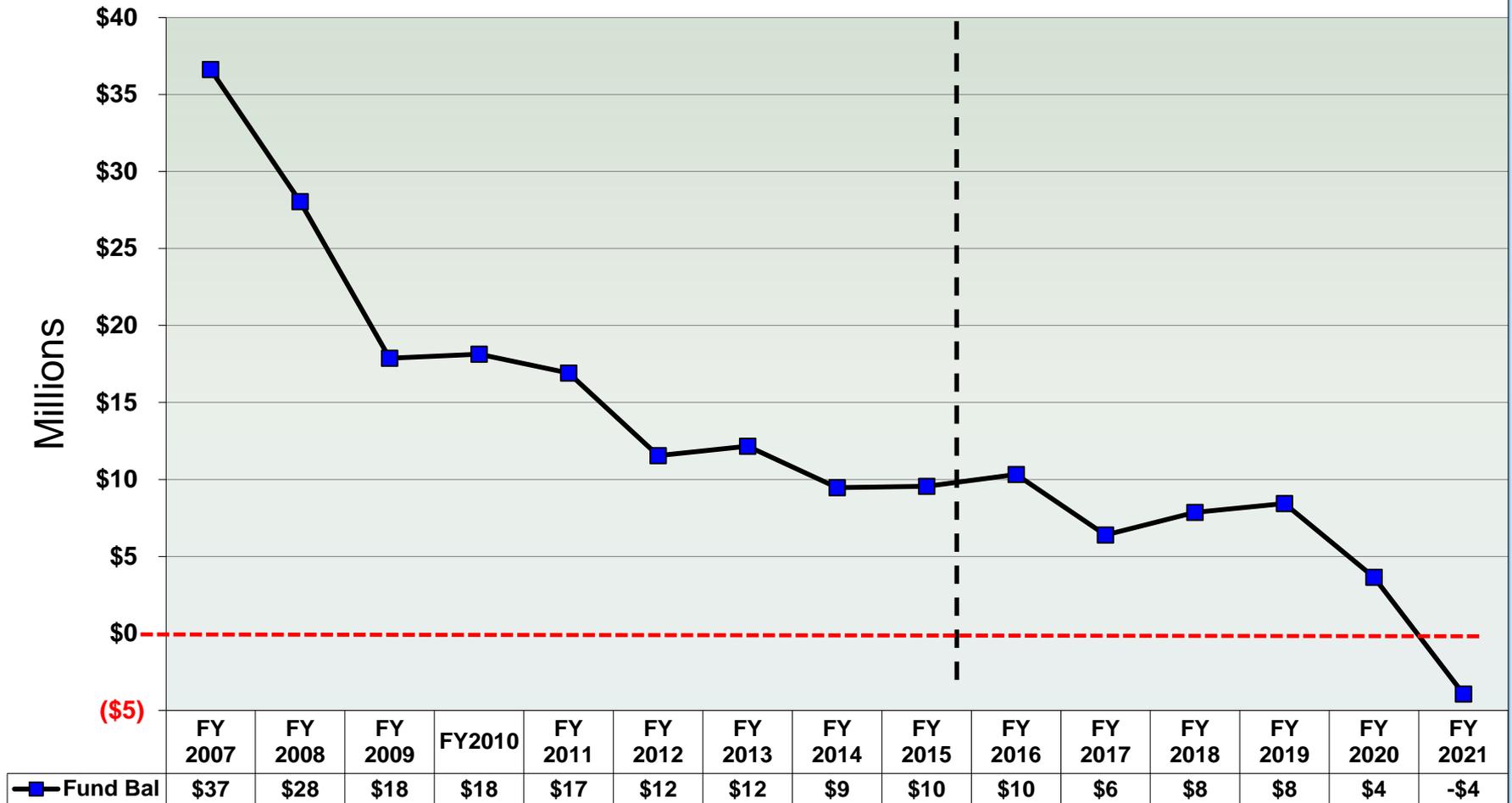


TIMBER HARVEST TAX REVENUES

Shows Harvest Tax Revenues received by program over the last nine biennia, plus the projection into the current biennium. These revenues are collected by the Department of Revenue from timber harvesters. The rates are set each legislative session. The amounts for the current biennia are projected amounts plus actual for quarters completed.
