I appreciate the opportunity to represent Green Diamond on the Eastern Oregon Forest Practices Committee. I have worked in the forestry industry for 40 years most of which was in operations. Early in my career I worked for a logging company that was diverse in different logging systems, conventional ground based, cable or high lead, mechanical ground based, and cut to length systems I worked my way up through the company gaining experience in all of the different operations. In 1990 I ventured out on my own starting my own contract logging and road construction company. During this time I became a Oregon Professional Logger and also was certified in California and have worked on many different forests in Oregon and California including both government and private sector. In 2008 while contract logging on this tree farm formerly owned by JWTR the owner Dick Wendt ask me to sell my company to him and come on board to manage all of the company operations. In March of 2008 I sold the company to JWTR and my wife and I moved from Ashland to Klamath Falls and I began managing all the company woods operations. In 2014 Green Diamond Resources Co. purchased the tree farm from JWTR and I was asked to stay on as the Logging and Chipping Manager, currently I oversee 3 in woods chipping operations, 1 cable logging side, 5 company shears thinning plantations, 10 chip Trucks, Truck shop with 5 mechanics and 3 service field trucks. During my time here I have had the opportunity to work very closely with the forestry staff which has many years of experience managing this tree farm.
