2017 was a relatively quiet year with 14 fires. 1 fire could not be accessed until the following day. BLM asked for our assistance with the landowner in order to gain access. The fire was on Forest Service land.

Jerry Rank and Darren Koch have met with the BLM several times for training/planning sessions. Jerry Rank and Cheryl Smith have attended all the Harney County Wildfire Collaborative meetings and are continuing to do so. Louis Smith attended 2 during 2017. These meeting have been instrumental in bridging gaps

between RFPA's and BLM. Louis and Cheryl Smith also attended the SageCon Summit in Baker City and helped Marvin with his presentation there. Another indication of cooperation becoming the normal instead of the unusual or rare. Louis and Cheryl have also become members of the Harney County Restoration Collaborative and have closed the gap somewhat with the forest service as a result. Currently Cheryl is involved with the Community Based Water Planning Pilot Program that is working on the problem of water shortages in the Great Harney Basin. We had two trainings during 2017. We now have 45 trained volunteers and another 42 that have indicated they will assist when needed. Our membership base increased from 202 to 250 households this year. This only represents about 50% of the owned land within our 2209 square mile area that we protect. We have significantly impacted 4 separate communities and we are the only fire protection available other than BLM or Forest Service to them. Jerry Rank and Cheryl Smith have been working with Harney County through the 911 and Alert Sense programs. Jerry was elected to represent all 5 of the RFPA's in Harney County at the Summit last year. Alert sense has made a huge difference in false alarms. There was only 1 this last year and part of this is also through the people getting fire permits and calling in before they burn. We are continuing to reach out to our friends and neighbors and helping them become more aware of what our association is and what we do.

Fields-Andrews completed its utilization of OWEB grant funds during the early months of 2017. Considerable volunteer time was devoted to vehicle maintenance; clerical administration; attending a veritable plethora of meetings with the Harney County Wildfire Collaborative, BLM, and Harney County government officials; and training.

The biggest fire challenge experienced in 2017 was the Upper Mine Fire which

threatened several structures including the Harney Electric Fields Compound as well as residences. All RFPA personnel rose to this challenge and enjoyed positive cooperative interaction with BLM and Harney Electric personnel. The Upper Mine Fire was the first to utilize a joint incident command approach between BLM districts in Oregon and Nevada.

Fields-Andrews greatest challenge to its immediate future is the absence of younger community members willing to serve on the Board of Directors and take on the administration of the RFPA .

After 20 years of relying on grants and periodic membership solicitations, the Board voted in February, 2018 to adopt an annual membership dues structure. This should provide a more stable and reliable funding base for the RFPA, and, it is hoped, generate greater community interest in serving on the Board.

Narrative: Greater Pine Valley RFPA was fortunate that we were able to spot our fires quickly and ,with the help of other agencies, rapidly attack the fires. This resulted small acreage fires with rapid containment. Worked successfully with Forest Service

and BLM fire crews on Federal property.

We were also fortunate that no fires resulted in our area during the solar eclipse in August. Prior extensive planning with BLM, Forest Service, ODF and Baker county agencies placed resources in high risk areas to minimize travel time to potential fires. GPV RFPA had split resources with Pine Valley Ranch crews placed on Hwy 86 between Halfway and Richland. Idaho Power crews were placed in the BLM low hills area east of Halfway. Contract dozers were on alert and ready to go if we called.

GPV RFPA members are becoming the source of information to locals when lightning or smoke columns are seen in the area. We are often called before dispatch is called. We have also been called by county authorities to verify smoke or reports of fire in our area.

We have learned from each fire experience and have altered our methods and tools used in fighting range fires.

Matt Williams (President) and Cara Lacy (Secretary) took over the administration of the RFPA, so 2017 was a transition year for the RFPA. The RFPA was concerned about the influx of visitors expected for the August 2017 Solar Eclipse and the high fire danger after a particularly wet spring. The group held a Spring radio training session to make sure the radios were operational and volunteers were familiar with their usage. A large number of volunteer hours were spent making sure that the pumpers were full, the vehicles operational and volunteers ready in the event of a large fire. Thankfully, the fire season was remarkably quiet. The Association expended its OWEB funds for vehicle maintenance parts and a chainsaw for fire suppression. The Association is looking forward to be more active in 2018 and is actively seeking new volunteers.
