After retaining from a 50+ pear career with Boise Cascade as forcetter and log buyer among other rotes, Church Sarrest still could not get enough free shy work in his file. In 2018 came a visiond assed from local NRCS offices of Inaformus a mediang forcet management plans (FMF) in order to be slightle for cost-share programs. Church saw a need and did encrything he could to meet that need, After helping finelitate a training program for local, private forcetters on how to write a FMF Church decided to take the Sanaccial risk and began Full Carele Counthing in hoppe of giving local forcetters a brusiness to work within to braild a team that informs landowners of the importance of managing timber stands in northeasters a brusiness. The earthwise mit at Church and his counterpart have bestowed within our landowners has resulted in thousands of acres treated in our area for fire resilience and forcet health.

After heaving of the development in our region, American Forestry Foundation (AFF) executably formed an agreement with the NR/C3 after working with Sarret Generally, which even included an eastern Oregon field tour with AFF representatives from across the country. The partnership between NR/CS/AFF allows for plans to be written for the to landowners and compensation to the indevidual who writes from plan in early and recent pure. Clouds developed countries for his adequate the FMF program started and has since been asked they needledowing states for his expectice in helping to get their programs started as well thus to the immenus success seen in our Easteen Oregon program.

Not only do landowners become more knowledgedie on their forestand as a whole when a FMP is written, but almost 90% of handowners conduct some knd of forest management in the next 2-3 years after the plan writing process. Whether it is a cost-share finels reduction project, commercial harvest, or something in between, landowner's education on their imbediends through the FMP process has proven to increase management in our region statemently. This is a monumental victory in forestry for our area. Since 2018, Clinic's company has produced 12% forest management plans areass \$9,60% imbered areas and provided controllers hours constrained to local handowners on timber management.

Clinck has weiced that beginning Full Circle Countling in retirement has fulfilled his career and has allowed him to enjoy his work now more than ever before.






Image 1. Property boundary represents a great comparison of pre and post management imber stands. This landowner's property tooked very similar to their neighbor's property on the left pre management.





image 2. Visible stream buffer of small, fish bearing stream post management
