nurturing environments that enable them to thrive; and

WHEREAS: Dedicated resource families and relative caregivers work tirelessly to provide children a

secure and nurturing environment and give young people in foster care the love, warmth,

WHEREAS: In Oregon there are children and young people waiting for loving families to support them

during their time in care, and it is important to ensure all qualified resource families and relative caregivers have the opportunity to serve, regardless of race, religion, sexual

orientation, gender identity, or marital status, and that no barriers exist as we invest in efforts

to retain our current families and recruit more families for children and young people in

foster care; and

WHEREAS: There are many ways to help our children, including by providing respite care, volunteering

as a Court Appointed Special Advocate, and taking a role as a caseworker; and

WHEREAS: Individuals and public and private organizations can help by increasing public awareness of

the need for more resource families, caregivers, and community support of children in foster

care.
