Oregon Department of Education, Early Learning Division Title IV-B2 Family Preservation and Family Support Services Fiscal Year 2021 Annual Report

Title IV-B2 Family Preservation and Family Support Services funds are received by the Oregon Department of Education, Early Learning Division from the Oregon Department of Human Services. Title IV-B2 funds support the provision of community-based family support services in four goal areas: Early Childhood Development/Early Learning; Child Abuse and Neglect Prevention; Adolescent Risk Factors; and Child Poverty.

In Fiscal Year 2021, funding to Healthy Families Oregon was used to support parents in cultivating and strengthening a nurturing, positive relationship with their baby and to promote healthy child growth and development. Through home visits, parents were educated and offered tools, resources, and supports that promote stable, attached families.

During the year, the Early Learning Hubs utilized Title IV-B2 funds to support children and families in various programs including; funding parent educators who engaged children and families by providing personalized coaching and support and resource referrals. With COVID still active, services, in some cases, continued to focus on helping families meet their basic needs, and providing information and resources on COVID-19 vaccination, prevention and care. Family resource coordinators connected families to vital services. Parents were supported through parent cafes, parent education online, welcome baby bags and a pregnant mom's support group.

The Early Learning Division will continue to use these funds to support services designed to improve parenting skills; provide structured activities to parents and children to strengthen the parent-child relationship; transportation, information and referral services; and early developmental screening of children.
