

Amendment to May 1, 2026 Progress Report

**Wyatt B., et al. v. Tina Kotek, et al.
June 18, 2026**

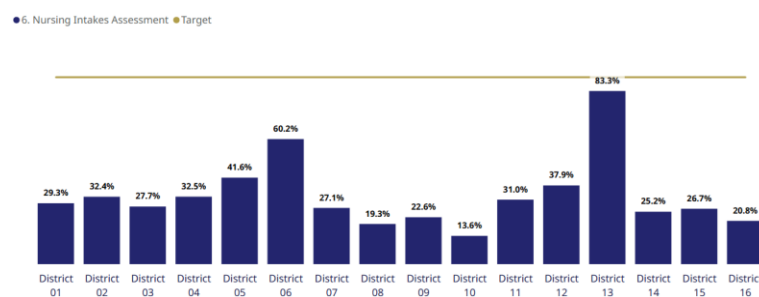
Summary

On May 1, 2026, the Oregon Department of Human Services submitted the first [Progress Report](#) required by the settlement agreement of the Wyatt B., et al. v. Tina Kotek, et al. This Amendment provides corrections to that report in two areas, nursing assessments and maltreatment in care notification and reporting.

Measurement 6: Nursing Assessments

The Ultimate Outcome for Measurement 6 requires that at least 90 percent of children entering substitute care receive a completed ODHS nursing assessment within 10 days of entry to substitute care. This is a new measure that ODHS has not previously reported on. Due to a data filtering error in building the new report, the May 1 report incorrectly reported the baseline for calendar year 2025 to be 80.6 percent ¹. The correct baseline for calendar year 2025 is 30.1 percent.

Figure 1 below shows the corrected performance on timely nursing assessments by district.²

Measurement 13: Maltreatment in Care Notification and Reporting

Measurement 13 requires that ODHS ensure compliance with applicable Oregon statutes regarding notification to identified legal parties within three days of a report of abuse of a child in care. While baseline year performance will not be established until 2028, ODHS provided a summary of efforts the agency has undertaken to consistently meet the reporting targets as well as create a qualitative review process for future measurement.

Two of the efforts listed as completed in the “Technical Improvements” section are underway but were not yet completed at the time of the May 1, 2026 report.³

These two efforts are as follows:

- Alert sent to assigned primary caseworker when the screening report is generated, requiring the caseworker to notify all legal parties within 3 days of assignment
- Alert sent to assigned primary caseworker when the assessment has been approved by the supervisor, requiring the caseworker to submit all documentation within 5 days of approval.

The November 1, 2026 report will provide a further update on these efforts.
