

## Integrated Client Services (ICS)

### Data requests executed and completed 2003 to 2021



ICS is a data warehouse that integrates (combines) data from across several state agencies and programs (e.g., ODHS, OHA) to link the identities of individual persons across those programs with the services they have been provided with. This process provides state agencies and researchers with a common person identifier that can be used to assess or analyze how people in Oregon access state services across various programs (for example, how many people are enrolled in both Medicaid and SNAP benefits) and facilitates tracking changes in access to state services that may affect program budgeting and costs. ICS contains:

- A **client index** (common, unique identifiers) that links persons across various ODHS and OHA program (as well as other state programs, such as Education, Corrections, and Vital Records)
- “**Caseloads**”, or the program-related services (SNAP benefits, for instance) provided to persons/clients and the dates of service. Note that ICS does not contain ODHS and OHA program services provided—only those that are part of budgetary forecasting. Requests for ICS data should consider whether program data at the source would be more appropriate for specific projects and should consult directly with programs providing services (e.g., SNAP, Medicaid, etc.).
- Basic demographic information

ICS does not contain detailed data about individuals or the services they have accessed. For those needs, ICS works with researchers that request ICS data to provide “crosswalks” of program identifiers so that specific program data can be linked to ICS client indexes. In most cases, datasets provided to researchers are de-identified (i.e., personally identifiable information removed) to maintain confidentiality.

The following tables summarize most all (2003-2021) data requests from researchers (or state programs) where the ICS program has provided research datasets or “crosswalks” to assist researchers for the purposes of:

- Linkage of records between two or more administrative data sets or leveraging existing linked records in ICS to create integrated data sets for research related to social services, health or education
- Understanding overlap of government services and programs among persons accessing state services
- Statistical forecasting of ‘caseloads’ to track trends in services provided to understand and predict future changes in program costs
- Analysis of integrated data for reporting outcomes related to services (to improve service delivery, for instance)
