OFFICE OF THE GOVERNOR

- WHEREAS:** Oregon's children are all of our children, and we have a responsibility to create safe, nurturing environments that enable them to thrive; and
- WHEREAS:** Dedicated resource families and relative caregivers work tirelessly to provide children a secure and nurturing environment and give young people experiencing foster care the love, warmth, safety, care, and support they need; and
- WHEREAS:** In Oregon there are children and young people waiting for loving families to support them during their time in care, and it is important to ensure all qualified resource families and relative caregivers have the opportunity to serve, regardless of race, religion, sexual orientation, gender identity, or marital status, and that no barriers exist as we invest in efforts to retain our current families and recruit more families for children and young people experiencing foster care; and
- WHEREAS:** There are many ways to help our children, including by providing respite care, volunteering as a Court Appointed Special Advocate, and taking a role as a caseworker; and
- WHEREAS:** Individuals and public and private organizations can help by increasing public awareness of the need for more resource families, caregivers, and community support of children experiencing foster care.

THEREFORE:** I, Tina Kotek, Governor of the State of Oregon, hereby proclaim May 2026 to be

FOSTER CARE MONTH

in Oregon and encourage all Oregonians to join in this observance.
