

In-Home Supports for People with Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities

**Do you or a loved one have an intellectual or developmental disability (I/DD)?
Do you live in your own or family home?**

The Oregon Department of Human Services (ODHS) Office of Developmental Disability Services (ODDS) is here for you. You have three ways to get support at home. No matter which you choose, you get:

- **Support at home:** Workers help you live the life you want.
- **Choice and control:** Choose who helps you and how they help you.
- **Safety first:** All workers pass background checks and meet basic rules.
- **Peace of mind:** Our partners handle paychecks, so you don't have to.
- **Respect:** Workers must treat you fairly and respect your choices.

Choose from three in-home provider options. Each has a different level of support

Talk with your services coordinator or personal agent about these options. Choose what works best for you.

Personal Support Worker

You're the employer.

Hiring: You interview and hire your workers.

Managing support: You make the schedule and check on your workers. If needed, you can get support.

Training and oversight: Workers attend required orientation. You teach them about your needs and goals.

Employer Model Agency

Agency and you work together.

Hiring: You pick your workers. Agency helps with paperwork.

Managing support: You and the agency manage workers together.

Training and oversight: You and the agency train and supervise workers. Agency hears your feedback.

Standard Model Agency

Agency helps with everything.

Hiring: Agency hires workers to fit your needs. If you want, you can help them.

Managing Support: Agency makes schedules, finds backup workers, tracks progress, and plans activities.

Training and oversight: Agency trains and supervises workers. You can get help from a supervisor at any time.
