

New Meadows Application

This application is an opportunity for you to describe your goals and needs, helping us to determine if this program is a good fit for you. In order to demonstrate readiness, we ask that youth fill out this application completely on their own behalf. Please let us know if you need any specific accommodations or support to do so.

New Meadows Overview

New Meadows at the Dorothy Lemelson House is a life skills building housing program designed to help young people – those who are ages 18-24 and aging out of foster care – launch into adulthood. This program is a collaboration between New Avenues for Youth and Bridge Meadows, and is meant to foster long-term connectivity and relationship between elders and families living in Bridge Meadows and youth living at New Meadows. Since New Meadows' goal is for youth to increase their self-sufficiency, each participant will pay a program fee which will increase over time.

Funded in part by Portland Housing Bureau's Interstate Corridor Renewal Project, New Meadows give waiting list priority to applicants who have lived themselves or have family that currently live or have lived in North/Northeast Portland in the past (see questions on page 6 of the application).

Eligibility:

Must be able to live in an unsupervised environment.
Age: focused on young people 18-24 years.
Must have had an open DHS case past their 18 th birthday.
Focused on DHS Independent Living Program (ILP)-eligible youth, some exceptions can
be made based on circumstance.
Must be current and former foster youth (care/custody, voluntary).
Must attend information session to ensure youth understands the environment.
Willing and able to maintain 36 productive hours (volunteer, school, education, etc.).
0-30% average median income (AMI)
o Income for one young person entering the program must be lower than \$1866.66
monthly (or \$ 22,400 annually).
o Income for one young person and child entering the program must be lower than
\$2133.33 (or \$ 25,600 annually).
Priority is given to youth who meet all other criteria and reside in or have historical family
ties to North/Northeast Portland (however this is not required to live at New Meadows).
Willing to engage with the intergenerational community at Bridge Meadows.
Parenting youth:
 Must be parenting or pregnant (third trimester or later).

You'll also receive a copy of the Program Handbook at this time, which you are expected to read to learn more about the program.

By submitting this application, you're expressing interest in participating in this program. At the end of this application you will find two Release of Information forms, both of which will need to be signed, allowing us to verify you are transitioning out of foster care/DHS, and also learn more about you from former landlords or other references. Additionally, turning in a completed budget form will be necessary so we can verify your income eligibility for this program. Once you submit this application, we will review the application and verify your foster care/DHS involvement, income, student status (if necessary) and contact references. All candidates will be contacted regarding status of application and eligible candidates will be offered a time to schedule an interview.

If you are accepted into New Meadows, you will receive a move-in date and be connected to the New Meadows Case Manager, who will set up your orientation and intake session.

Requirements upon Program Entry:

Prospective residents need to continuously demonstrate that they are actively pursuing goals that will lead you to gaining self-sufficiency skills.

Once living at New Meadows, you must continue to work with your support team on individualized, self-stated goals. In addition, all youth are expected to maintain up to 36 hours of productive time each week (school, work, community engagement, etc.). If you are not meeting this productive time requirement when you enter the program, you will need to work with your Case Manager and an ILP skills coach to achieve 36 hours a week of productive time within the first 30 days.

Your Case Manger will regularly review the program requirements below including a review every 90 days to assess your progress on goals and life skills.

The basic requirements for the program are the following:

- Meet with your Case Manager weekly for the first three months (meeting frequency may decrease after 90 days depending on individual needs).
- Maintain 36 productive hours per week.

- Demonstrate willingness to participate in community activities.
- Attend Monthly House Meetings.
- While in the New Meadows community we ask that you respect yourself, your peers, your home and the New Meadows staff. Please review the Non-Negotiable Safety Agreement section of the Program Handbook to understand

Available Services:

The following services are available to each resident: career training; educational support; independent living skills training; access to basic food supplies, transportation support; cooking & laundry facilities; counseling support; and access to New Avenues clothing closet. **New Meadows does not provide child care.**

Length of Stay:

New Meadows is designed to help you launch into your own, self-sufficient housing. While everybody's readiness time frame is different, the initial term period for housing is 12 months. After a year, youth can apply for an extension to continue in the program for a second year.


