MEDICARE OVERVIEW

- \bullet Medicare starts at age 265 or after 24 months of SSDI
- Can delay enrollment without penalty if covered by an Employee Group Health Plan (EGHP) through active work (self or spouse)
 - However, Medicare is <u>primary</u> if EGHP has less than 20 employees in group health plan
- Part A is <u>inpatient</u> hospital insurance covering room, board, general nursing and supplies, and drugs
- Part B is hospital <u>observation</u> or outpatient stays, physician's fees, labs, medical equipment, preventive services, etc.
- Part C is private contracted Medicare called Medicare Advantage plans (health only or health + drug)
- Part D is stand-alone prescription drug insurance

Original Medicare

Patient pays

Part A - Covers most costs for:

- Hospital
- Home Health Care
- Hospice
- Skilled Nursing Services

Deductible and co-ins

Part B - Covers 80% of approved costs for:


- Doctors' services Medical Equipment
- Lab work
- Emergencies, etc.


Premium + 20% after deductible

Part D

Prescription Coverage

Premium + deductible + co-pays / co-insurance





A "MEDIGAP" policy is one way to cover the costs that Original Medicare doesn't pay.

Medigap does not cover prescriptions. Separate insurance, such as a Part D plan, must be added for this benefit.

So, what happens when people can't afford to pay these costs?

Part A - Pays 80%

They might qualify for financial help -

- Medicare Savings Programs to pay, at minimum, the Part B premium
- Limited Income Subsidy (LIS or "Extra Help") to pay the Part D premium, deductible, reduced co-pays, and some or all of the "donut hole".

LOW INCOME SUBSIDY

- Federal program that allows eligible individuals or couples to qualify for prescription drug insurance premium subsidy and lower cost share at pharmacy
- Eligibility determined by
 - Application to Social Security
 - Deemed eligible if receiving state assistance
- Applying online is the most expeditious
- Determinations typically within 3-4 weeks
- Oregon Medicare Savings Connect and SHIBA will process online applications

MEDICARE SAVINGS PROGRAMS

- State assistance with the costs associated with Medicare
- Called Qualified Medicare Beneficiary (QMB) at state offices
 - QMB BAS is the highest level of assistance covering the Part B monthly premium, deductibles and coinsurances
 - QMB SMB covers only the Part B monthly premium
 - QMB SMF covers only the Part B monthly premium
- Resources are NO LONGER COUNTED

Medicare Savings Program is a state Medicaid program that pays the Medicare Part B premium. If eligible for QMB (100% FPL), the program also pays the deductibles and cost shares associated with Medicare services.

OREGON MEDICARE SAVINGS CONNECT (OMSC)

- Funded by a grant from the Medicare Improvement for Patients and Providers Act (MIPPA)

OREGON MEDICARE SAVINGS CONNECT

- Toll free access to help with benefit programs
- Live coverage M-F, 8-5;
 24 hours voice mail available
- Provides application assistance for the federal LIS program
- Provides application assistance for the MSP (QMB) program
 - Forwards referrals to local APD offices
- Provides referrals to community resources by linking callers to AAA and ARDC offices
- Refers callers to local SHIBA offices for Medicare choice counseling



OREGON MEDICARE SAVINGS CONNECT

- Provides statewide outreach and education about LIS and MSP

LIMITED INCOME NET

- Allows those qualifying for the Limited Income Subsidy to purchase meds at the subsidy rate
- Bridges coverage until a prescription drug plan is chosen or assigned
- Requires verification of eligibility with best available evidence (BAE)
 - Letter of subsidy award from SSA
 - Letter of financial assistance from APD
- FAX BAE to LI NET within 21 days

OREGON PRESCRIPTION DRUG PROGRAM

- Free!
- Available to all Oregonians regardless of age, income, employment or health.
- Bulk prescription drug purchase in partnership with the state of Washington
- Provides up to 16 percent discount on brand name and 69 percent discount on generic medications

- We provide medications to those who need but cannot afford them for a small co-pay

SHIBA

- Senior Health Insurance Benefits Assistance (SHIBA) is the State Health Insurance Information Program (SHIP) for Oregon
- Funded by a grant from ACL with additional support from the Div of Financial Regulation
- Provides insurance choice counseling and advocacy for Medicare beneficiaries, their families and/or caregivers



SHIBA

- Provides application assistance for the federal Low Income Subsidy
- Refers to local APD offices when applicable
- Provides education and outreach through public presentations
- Assists with fraud prevention and reporting
- 17 local sponsors and 280 certified counselors statewide

What kind of help can I get?

Medicare Savings Programs pay the monthly bill for your Part B coverage, and may pay other costs, too.

Extra Help ("LIS") pays for some of your Part D drug coverage, and may help you pay less at the pharmacy.

Am I eligible?

JOB AIDS

You might be able to get help with Medicare costs.

Or maybe you know a person with Medicare who could use some help paying for Part B (health insurance) and Part D (drug coverage).

If your monthly income and your resources (savings) match the guidelines, you may be eligible:

*There is NO Estate Recovery (claim against your estate) with these programs. Income does not include up to \$2,000 per year received by an Alaska Native/American Indian that is derived from individual interests in trusts or restricted lands; or payments to members of specific Indian Tribes as provided by Federal legislation.
