<u>Message</u>: The Medicaid <u>HDM Standards and Responsibilities</u> guidelines are now available, located on the Case Management Tools website. These guidelines outline key responsibilities when providing Medicaid In-Home Delivered Meals (HDM) to eligible consumers: Medicaid Eligibility; Medicaid Program Responsibilities; and Nutrition Program Responsibilities.

HDM is an option to be discussed with Medicaid service eligible consumers. Some of the HDM benefits include:

- Contributing to the health and independence of an individual to remain in their own home
- Provide an individual with an additional face to face contact with the person who delivers the meal, thus reducing the feelings of loneliness
- Increasing the confidence of staying at home
- Lessening the concern for food insecurity (limitations in procuring and preparing meals)
- Increasing health and safety by providing a nutritional meal

HDM also supports case managers as the provider is considered an indirect contact.

The HDM provider list is found under the HDM section of CM Tools.

If an individual is not eligible for HDM through Medicaid, a new brochure has been developed: Community Meal Programs for Older Adults Brochure (DHS 2726). This brochure discusses community and home delivered meals that are funded through the Older Americans Act. This brochure was previously referenced in APD-IM-20-006.
