Message:

In response to the COVID-19 (coronavirus) concerns, APD wants to ensure that gloves and masks are available for homecare workers (HCWs) that are currently providing services to consumers.

Some offices may receive increased requests for gloves and masks and will therefore need to increase their supply that is on-hand.

Here are some things to keep in mind when distributing gloves and masks:

- Form <u>4106</u> is on the forms server and should be used to track requests for gloves and masks.
- Consumers should be seeking and applying for coverage through their medical benefits but can obtain gloves and masks while coverage is pending. However, requests for gloves and masks may be provided even if a request has not yet been made to the consumer's medical benefits.
- HCWs must be currently providing care for a consumer in order to obtain gloves or masks.

• The HCW should only be given a quantity that would correlate to tasks that need completed by a consumer-employer.

Quantity to have stocked in response to COVID-19:

GLOVES:

At a minimum, all offices should have 10 boxes or 1 case of small, medium, large and extra-large gloves in stock.

MASKS:

All Offices should have at least 3 boxes of masks in stock.

AAA Type A offices may elect to direct HCWs to the appropriate APD office instead of keeping a supply.

Supply and Demand:

Central Office has spoken with our vendors Excel and Rockwest and both companies report restrictions on masks. They have not reported restrictions on gloves.

- Rockwest suggests having purchasers call as opposed to ordering online to verify quantities available.
- Excel will take orders for masks, but all orders will be put on a list and allocated as the company deems necessary.

Local offices that encounter difficulties with obtaining any needed supplies should contact Traci Lerner (contact information is below), who will attempt to work out alternative arrangements.
