APD-licensed facilities.

#### **Purpose**

This policy is one of a series intended to provide policy direction regarding Adult Protective Services (APS) practice and documentation in APD and AAA local offices. Application of this policy will help to ensure a consistent statewide response to reports of abuse of adults eligible for APD protective services.

#### **Description**

This policy provides guidance to assist APS workers in making screening decisions when a report is received of an incident or altercation between residents in APD-licensed facilities.

## **Applicability**

This policy applies to all ODHS and Type "B" Area Agency on Aging staff providing Adult Protective Services as described in OAR Chapter 411, Division 020, <u>Adult Protective Services</u> – General.

#### **Policy**

APS screeners shall assess reports of incidents between residents and initiate a
 Facility APS abuse investigation for possible Neglect, as defined in OAR 411 020-0002(1)(b)(A), when the self-report indicates that the incident between
 residents:

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- a. Resulted in physical harm, significant emotional harm, unreasonable discomfort, or serious loss of dignity to one of the residents involved; or
- b. Placed one or more residents at risk of serious harm, defined in OAR 411-020-0002(39) to mean that, "...without intervention, the individual is likely to incur substantial injury or loss".
- 2. If a reported incident is assigned for APS investigation of possible facility Neglect, during the investigation APS staff shall also consider whether a Community APS abuse investigation of one of the residents involved is justified. (Refer to APD-APS-060-003, Screening Reports of APS-Eligible Persons as Alleged Perpetrators, for factors to consider when deciding whether to name a resident as an AP).
- 3. If, however, the reporter specifically names a facility resident as an alleged perpetrator in a report of abuse *and* the incident in question meets criteria for an abuse investigation, APS should document the caller's report accurately, naming the resident as an AP in a Community case, and investigate that allegation in addition to investigating possible Neglect by the facility. If the APS worker determines that the named resident/AP is, more likely than not, unable to understand and participate meaningfully in the investigation due to their disability or medical condition, Administrative Closure may be used as a closure mechanism for the Community investigation. The associated Facility investigation of potential Neglect related to the incident, however, should proceed.
