<u>Discussion/interpretation</u>: When writing licensing violations in APD and ODDS adult foster homes the licensors use a resident key/ person code sheet to support resident privacy in what are ultimately public documents. This privacy is potentially compromised when using gender specific pronouns as those identifiers could be used to support guesses as to whom the author is speaking of.

<u>Implementation/transition instructions</u>: When licensors are writing violations and narratives, they should use they/ them pronouns in all cases as opposed to utilizing gender specific he/ him or she/ her pronouns. This extra step will further aid in protecting resident privacy. Licensors may also use the resident's number from the

resident key/ person code sheet as an identifier without being gender specific.

Example: R1 (resident 1) requires assistance with mobility, or they require assistance with mobility instead of **she** requires assistance with mobility.

<u>Training/communication plan</u>: Review of this policy transmittal as needed.

<u>Local/branch action required</u>: Begin to use gender neutral language when writing licensing violations and narratives.
