

# Requesting a Research Appointment at the Oregon DOT Library and History Center

Thank you for your interest in researching at the <u>Oregon Department of Transportation</u> <u>Library and History Center</u>. Please review this guide for instructions on how to request inperson research.

#### Request a Research Appointment:

- 1. Email <u>ODOTLibrary@ODOT.Oregon.gov</u> to request an appointment.
- 2. Provide your **research area(s) of interest** and allow for the librarian to verify the materials are available.
  - a. The more specific your request, the more accurately the librarian can verify materials are available.
- 3. Expectations:
  - a. Expect at least 24 48 hours for an initial response.
  - b. Follow up questions on your topic(s) of interest are likely.
  - c. Appointments are unlikely to be immediate so please understand it may take a week or more from the time of the request to the time of the appointment.
  - d. Appointments are based on availability.
- 4. For your research appointment:
  - a. Bring your own scanning equipment such as a camera or smart phone.
    - i. There may be exceptions to what it allowed to be scanned.
    - ii. If you are not able to scan it yourself, you must submit a <u>Public</u> <u>Records Request</u> for the information. The librarian is not available to scan it for you during your research day.
