

### Researching Oregon State Highways

Are you interested in the history of state roads in Oregon? Good news! We have digital access available for many of the records. Follow the steps below to start your research and find digitally available documents. Also included are instructions for records that may not be digitally accessible.

### Step 1: Read through our History of State Highways in Oregon publication

Start here: History of State Highways in Oregon

This document provides a timeline of state highways in Oregon. It includes references to documents that record and further expand on the history of each highway.

Please note that this guide is specific to state highways so it will not have a history of local or county roads. You will need to contact your county records office for that information.

## Step 2: Access documents referenced in the History of State Highways in Oregon
