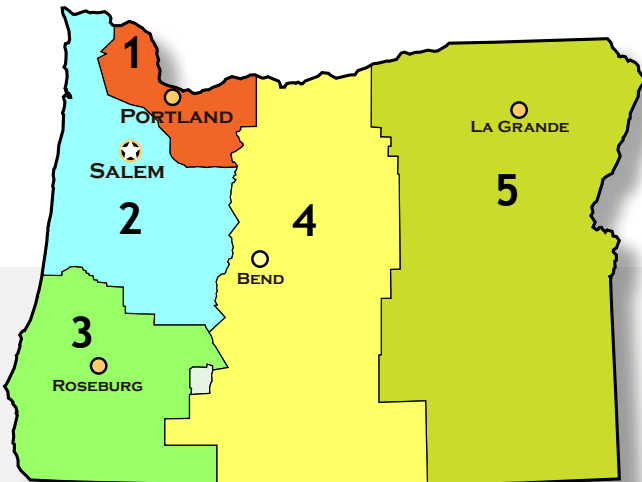
DON'T JUST LIVE YOUR FUTURE... CREATE IT!

The ODOT Graduate Program is designed to develop new and recent graduates into subject matter experts. Make the transition from student to full-time professional with ODOT, a leader in transportation innovation!

Successful applicants are accepted into full-time, permanent positions with benefits packages, an excellent work/life balance and a competitive salary.

Opportunities are available throughout the state, which ODOT divides into five geographical regions – each with its own unique charm.



GRADUATE PROGRAMS

For up to 24 months, program participants rotate assignments throughout ODOT engineering and survey disciplines to gain varied experience. Participants are regular, full-time, salaried employees. A registered professional (PE or PLS) provides mentoring throughout the program and the entire experience can provide up to two years qualifying time toward obtaining a professional license.

To qualify for these programs you must have a bachelor's degree in civil or transportation-related engineering or a Fundamentals of Engineering (FE) or Fundamentals of Surveying (FS) certificate.

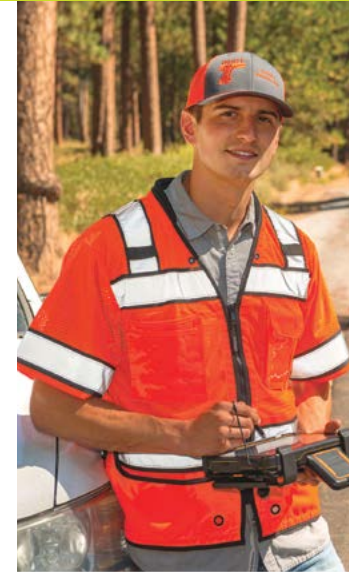

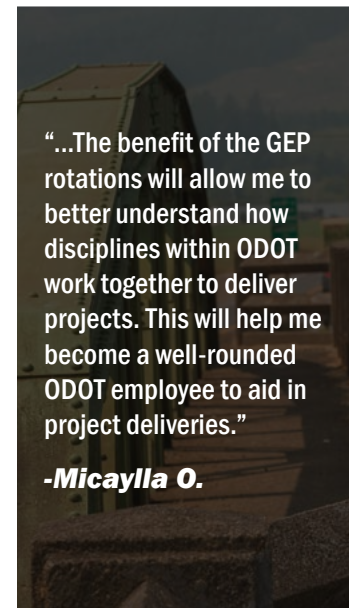
