

How do I get a title by mail?

Use this checklist and the resources provided to prepare your title transaction. Mail all the documents and your check or money order to DMV. If we have questions, you will get a letter.


Please note: DMV is getting much more mail than usual. There will be a long delay. Check the Attention section at the top of our [title information](#) page for estimated delays.

What you'll need:

- The original ownership document (Manufacturer's Certificate of Origin, Oregon title or title from another state).
- Signatures releasing interest from all former owners on the ownership document or on a bill of sale.
- An Application for Oregon Title and Registration, form [226](#).
- Correct fees for the transaction. **TIP:** Wrong fees are the most common reason for a processing delay. Submitting the correct fee helps us get your new title issued faster.
- You may need additional items, depending on your transaction and situation. If you are unsure after reading the information on our website, please [call DMV](#).

Follow these easy steps:

1. Visit our [Title/Register Your Vehicle](#) page at oregondmv.com for instructions and requirements for your title application.
2. Get a VIN inspection at one of our [drive-up VIN inspection sites](#) or [make an appointment](#) if the title instructions for your situation, from step 1 above, require the inspection.
 - **TIP:** If you live in a [DEQ area](#), and need a DEQ [Certificate of Compliance](#), you may ask DEQ to inspect the VIN when you get your emissions test.
3. Calculate your title fees.
 - **Passenger vehicle (car, pickup, SUV)?** Use our NEW [Passenger Fee Calculator](#)!



- **Non-passenger vehicle?**

- a) Visit our [Fees](#) page. You can use the table on the right to help calculate the fees to send.
- b) For Oregon-titled vehicles:
 - A \$25 late title transfer fee is due if you apply for a title 31-60 days after the sale. A \$50 late fee is due if you apply after 60 days. Some exceptions apply.
 - If you purchased it on or after March 1, 2020, fill out the lower section of [DMV Form 6775](#) to request an exemption, since DMV offices have been closed.
- c) Add the \$7 VIN fee if DMV, DEQ or Oregon dealer did a VIN inspection.

4. Calculate your registration fees (if renewing or getting new Oregon plates). The registration fee is based on the same combined miles per gallon (MPG) rating of your vehicle, used for the title fee. Use the [fee calculator](#) for **passenger vehicles**. For **non-passenger vehicles**, follow the instructions below.

- If your vehicle already has Oregon plates that do not expire soon, you do not need to renew them.
- If the Oregon plates on your vehicle expire in 90 days or less, or are already expired, you can pay to [renew them](#) when you send in your title application.
- Plate transfer and replacement plate information and fees are [available online](#). They are based on the plate type you are transferring or want to get as a replacement for your current Oregon plate.
- If your vehicle does not have Oregon plates, you can pay for [plates and registration](#) when you send in your title application.

Expired or no Oregon plates? You may [request a Trip Permit](#) online. A trip permit can be used until December 31, 2020 even if it is expired.

5. Mail the application, required documents and check or money order for the total fee to:

You can mail your transaction by any service you select. If you wish to send your transaction by a delivery method that uses tracking numbers, we will record the receipt using that number. Please note that transactions will be worked in order by the date received, regardless of the delivery service.
